



# Thought for the Week



'Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?"' (John 11:25-26 NIV)


So Easter is over, all the hunts have finished and all the chocolate has been eaten (or most of it at least). Is that it then?

Recently, someone I know shared a video of their children tucking into some Easter eggs. It was first thing in the morning, but it was also Easter Sunday, so it's understandable. When someone commented with 'not too much chocolate though!', the response was 'Ah, but that's what it's all about!'. It wasn't until much later that I wished I'd replied with 'If chocolate Easter eggs is what Easter is all about, it makes it rather *hollow*!' 😁

Is Easter just a long Bank Holiday with extra chocolate? To an outsider, it might appear like that. They would see people enjoying time away from school and work and spending time with family and friends. Maybe they'd see people sharing meals together and having Easter egg hunts. Or maybe they'd see people catching up on some DIY or even sitting in traffic jams. But after those four days are over, is there anything left?

In today's verse, Jesus' claim is very bold and many would say contentious. But he makes the claim anyway. And John's Gospel was written by one of his disciples, so it's likely that he was in earshot. Interestingly, Jesus says this to Mary, the sister of Lazarus who had recently died and had now been buried for four days. When he asks her the question, 'Do you believe this?', she responds with a definite 'Yes, Lord'. This was while she was mourning the death of her own brother. You can read on in John 11, to find out what happens next.

What does it mean for us though? As someone once said, Jesus was either a lunatic, a liar or LORD. There is no middle ground. We can't just say he was a good teacher, who said some amazing things that can help us to navigate our way through life. There are many people from many different religions and backgrounds who said (and still say) wise things, but unlike Jesus, none of them claimed (or claim) to be God. But this was Jesus' claim and he was also saying he was the one way to heaven. Was he mad? Was he lying? Or is he really LORD?

So the next time you go for some chocolate, maybe take a moment to think about this. If Easter is just about chocolate eggs, that's all well and good. But is there more to this celebration? Did someone really die on a cross in our place? Were they really buried in a tomb that was empty two days later - on the third day? Did they really show that they had power over life and death? Maybe? Maybe not? It's still a bold claim that's worth investigating. Otherwise, it makes Easter rather hollow!
