

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
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Thought of the Week

'There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear.' (1 John 4:18)



I was genuinely inspired last week by the children from Year 4 who went on camp. Not only did they manage all of the tasks set for them on the low ropes and orienteering, but many of them showed real bravery and courage by abseiling fifteen metres down a sheer cliff face. Some of them looked genuinely worried on their way down, but they persevered and didn't give up.

I also took the challenge, but unlike many of the children who did it, I only went once and I can't say I enjoyed myself. The children were buzzing so much after their first attempt, that many of them went again. It was one of those days that I will remember for many years to come. What inspired me most of all is the way the children had absolute trust in the leaders. The two instructors showed real care and compassion with all of the children, but they also managed to instil a real sense of trust. If the children hadn't been confident that the instructors knew what they were doing and that they committed to keeping them safe, I don't think they would have been as 'fearless' as they were.

It reminds me of today's verse. In the example I'm sharing, it was as if the fear was driven out of these children. This was partly to do with the children themselves - they showed genuine courage and determination, but it was the genuine care and compassion of the instructors that also drove out any remaining fear.

Many Christians would say that when they are fearful about something, they will pray about it. This is so they can bring Jesus into the situation. Like the instructors, Christians would say that Jesus knows exactly what he's doing. They have complete trust in him, because he knows them better than they know themselves. Not only this, they know that they are genuinely, completely and wholeheartedly loved. No matter what they say or do, they are still loved and they know that they are loved because of who they are.

It's only when we know this perfect love, that fear can be driven out. And it isn't bad to know someone whose love can do that!
