Wow, we have been at school for a whole term and have learned so many new routines and songs to support our learning.

The Ducklings have been reading 'The Colour Monster'. This is supporting their emotional literacy and is helping the children talk about their feelings. We have created our own monsters and have written captions for them in Literacy. It has been lovely to hear everyone read at school and it is great that you are able to read at home at least four times a week.

In Mathematics we have been exploring measure and repeating patterns. We collected Autumn treasures and used them to create natural patterns. We have been human scales, trying to decide whether objects are bigger or smaller, lighter or heavier. We have used paints to create patterns and have created some beautiful still life pictures of pumpkins, leaves and conkers.

Thank you for your support with **'Wear Red for Racism'** day. The children have discussed equality and same/difference and understand that we are all unique individuals.

Wow! What an amazing first term it has been. We have been working really hard in Year 1 over the last seven weeks. I have been super impressed with all of Rabbit Class for their super learning.

In English we have been *writing our instructions* all about how to build a wooden bridge for a troll. Over the last few weeks, we have been testing the *physical properties of everyday materials* to see which material would make the best bridge. This week we have been comparing the materials to make the final decision about which material is best.

Finally, we really enjoyed our trip to the church to celebrate the harvest festival. Rabbit Class sat really well throughout the whole of the service. It was lovely to celebrate the **Harvest Festival** with the whole school.

Class News:

We've had a busy last few weeks of Term 1 but Badgers have worked hard right up to the last minute.

We have written our second story of the year. We have innovated the story of 'Billy the Brave Knight' who turns out not to be too brave after all. The children worked hard on including noun phrases and interesting sentence starters.

In Maths we have moved onto addition and subtraction. The children have used known facts to help them solve trickier questions. E.g. 4 + 3 = 7 so 40 + 30 = 70. They were also able to use these known facts to spot errors in calculations.

The children were really excited to start our first History unit of work on WW1 and Remembrance. They were fascinated by life in the trenches and were surprised that the soldiers were often bored! We will be learning much more about this next term.

Lastly, we enjoyed our first trip to the church this year to watch Y4 lead the Harvest Festival service. It was lovely celebrating together and the children sang beautifully.

Class News:

Such a wonderful end to our first term.

We have been busy writing our nonchronological reports about the *River* Nile. We have enjoyed researching lots of interesting information about it. We learned about headings and subheadings and applied this knowledge to our report writing.

During Maths lessons, we have been adding using the column method. We have been practising learning how to set out the columns and understanding what each number represents.

We have been *investigating magnets* in Science lessons. It was lovely to see the children enjoy investigating the strength of different types of magnets. The children were fascinated when they experimented with the North and South Poles. Some attracted really easily whilst others repelled.

In Art, we have made paper in the style of the Ancient Egyptians who used papyrus as the first ever paper. This was great fun. We have designed and created our scrolls, in the style of the Ancient Egyptians to represent our lives today.

We have used different sources of information to find out about Tutankhamun. We were fascinated to discover that he had over five thousand items in his burial chamber. These included board games and chariots!

In Computing, we have been learning about how computer systems work. We had lots of fun role-playing being a computer, switch or a server.

The whole school enjoyed a wonderful Harvest Festival service at St. Mary's Church that was led by our Year 4 pupils in Lion Class. The children explained what harvest is and why it is so important and then considered the food miles that various different foods have to travel before they get onto our plate. Using the analogy of a takeaway pizza that you might order from the local takeaway, the children demonstrated how in reality, the ingredients in the pizza have travelled thousands of miles around the world before turning up at our tables. It certainly made us think about the distance our foods have travelled. We finished

with some poetry and prayers written by the children. The whole school sang several harvest songs and the church was filled with the sound of the harvest celebration. Thank you for all of the generous food donations to the church. This year, the donations are being shared between Dairy House Hostel for the rural homeless in Stratton on the Fosse and to our local foodbank based in South Road Methodist church, here in Timsbury.

Show Racism The Red Card!

At St Mary's we wore red on Friday 13th October to show that we are anti racist. Everyone is welcome at our school. Anti racist means that we think racism is wrong.
