### Class News:

What a busy but wonderful first term! The children have been very creative over the past few weeks, making some amazing pieces for our school **Art Exhibition of Excellence**. They used their fine motor skills to print paint with pinecones, apples, and leaves, created some beautiful leaf art and Autumn trees, noticing what colours they could see on the changing leaves outside. They used their gross motor skills to roll conkers around in paint trays, being careful to use their coordination and balance to not let the conkers fall out!

Our focus books have been *"The Enormous Turnip"* and *"Elmer"*, both texts teaching us about being kind and helping others. We celebrated **Hello Yellow Day** for mental health and spent the day thinking about what makes us happy,

and practising mindfulness with relaxation, yoga and belly breathing.

Our Maths focus has been recognising shapes and colours, we even went on a hunt around the school to see what shapes we could find in our environment. The children have also enjoyed following our new "Recipe cards" on the mud kitchen, recognising the numbers of items to add to make some wonderful potions!

It has been so lovely to see the friendships develop over this term, the children have so much fun during group play with imagination games and role play.

## Class News:

What a fantastic first term at school Ducklings!

We have learned so much already and it has been lovely getting to know you all.

In Phonics, we have learned all of the phase 2 phonemes. Next term we will start to learn and recall phase 3 phonemes. Any reading and practise you can do over the half term holiday will help keep the children's learning fresh in their mind.

In Maths, we have been looking at the composition of numbers 1, 2 and 3. The children have continued to develop their understanding of patterns and enjoyed making repeated patterns from fruit and vegetables.

In Literacy, we have been reading *'The Colour Monster'* and have discussed all of the different emotions that we feel. The children have created their own monsters and have written a sentence about them using the learned sounds. We continue to add to our bank of common exception words, words that can not be sounded out phonetically.

We have enjoyed our PE topic and have developed skills in spatial awareness and following game rules. The children have shown fantastic teamwork skills and have supported each other's learning.

## Class News:



We've had a brilliant Term 1 in Badgers! Everyone has settled into their learning amazingly well and has continued to impress us with their hard work and enthusiasm. I've been especially blown away by the number of children logging into Numbots and TTRS at home every day, as well as the amount of extra writing and maths they've been bringing in to show me. Well done, Badgers!

In English, we've been writing some fantastic Kennings poems using our knowledge of badgers. The children have written clues to help the reader discover what (or who) their poem is about. We've been exploring the suffix **-er** in our poems and have also been learning about the **-ly** suffix and adverbs, creating posters to teach the Rabbits class everything we've learned.

In Maths, we've been focusing on addition and subtraction. We've used

a range of concrete resources and hundred squares to help us solve "ten more" and "ten less" problems. I've really noticed how much the Badgers' resilience has grown throughout this unit and how confidently they tackle challenges.

We've been working incredibly hard in Art to create our **Art Exhibition of Excellence**. Thank you to everyone who came to see all of Badgers' brilliant work on display! In History, we've started learning about the causes of World War I and what life was like in the trenches. In Geography, we've continued to explore maps—what they are for and how to use them.

Badgers have had a super first term back, and I can't wait to see all the amazing things they'll accomplish next term!

In Science we have been exploring *forces and magnets*. Most lessons have been filled with lots of hands-on learning. We have investigated how wide the magnetic field is, which materials are magnetic and whether all magnets are the same strength. We have enjoyed making predictions and analysing our results to find answers and patterns. We have even had a go at recording our data in a bar chart.

In Art, we had a very enjoyable time finishing our *Egyptian Scrolls* ready for display in the **Art Exhibition of Excellence** and the finished results looked fantastic. Continuing with our Egyptian theme, we enjoyed having lots of parents and family members in our classroom for an Egyptian themed workshop where we mummified a tomato! Thank you to those who came

along for your help with this one - it's very interesting to watch the mummification process in action at the moment and we can't wait to see the finished results!

In English, we have been busy writing a newspaper report about the wedding of the Egyptian Cinderella and also writing poetry to celebrate harvest. Speaking of which, well done to the Foxes for leading our harvest celebrations in church this week, you were all fantastic and spoke so clearly and confidently.

Finally, we enjoyed an afternoon of fun on our scooters provided to us by the B&NES Road Safety Team. The children learnt how to check their scooters to ensure they were in good condition, what good safety gear looks like and then how to scoot in a controlled and careful way paying attention to other pavement users.

Well done for a fabulous first term Foxes, have a great half term break!

# Lions

## Class News:



What a brilliantly successful Term 1 we have had. Well done to all of our Lions for settling so well into a new school year and establishing yourselves as motivated and dedicated learners. I've been so impressed.

We have continued to have a lot of fun as we've neared the end of this first term. We've been standing on tables (very safely) again in Science as we have completed our work involving investigating forces. This time, we were identifying the effects of air resistance on a range of paper helicopter spinners which had blades of different lengths. We concluded that spinners with longer blades took longer to reach the floor as there is more air resistance so they travel more slowly.

Our work in Music ended with us learning about musical notes and their different lengths. We then used the glockenspiels to play different

notes - quavers, crotchets, minims and semibreves - to accompany the music we have become familiar with during this topic of composition notation with an Ancient Egypt theme. We found this quite challenging to begin with but, with practice, ended up enjoying a successful outcome.

Finally, thank you to all of our visitors who joined us for the Parent Workshop, especially to those of you who were superstars and took part in the activity. Hopefully, you now understand what our weekly Readers' Theatre activity involves and why it has become such a favourite part of our week.

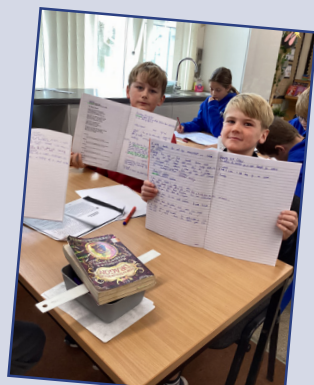

## Class News:



It has been a busy but productive term in Eagles so far! We have been working hard to settle into *the Year 6 way*, learning new concepts and being incredible role models for the younger pupils. Although it has been a challenging term, we've hit the ground running and are ready to tackle Term 2 with confidence and resilience.

In Maths, we have been learning the dreaded long division method - which turned out to be much more exciting than we expected! We took our time going through each step carefully until we were confident enough to apply the method to more complex problems. I have been so proud of the Eagles' efforts - they've been excellent mathematicians this term.

In History, we have loved learning about *World War II* and discovering how children were affected during this period. Eagles have been fascinated by what it meant to be evacuated, who was evacuated and how the Blitz impacted

their lives. To show their understanding, they wrote letters from the perspective of an evacuated child, beautifully capturing what life might have been like back then.

In Reading, we have been enjoying our class Guided Reading text, *"Warrior Boy"*. Eagles have been completely gripped by this story and have enjoyed unpicking tricky vocabulary to deepen their understanding. We have also been answering inference questions by finding clues in the text to make thoughtful inferences about the characters' emotions and personality traits.

It has been wonderful to see the Eagles approach every challenge with such enthusiasm, determination and teamwork. I am incredibly proud of all their hard work this term - they truly embody what it means to be outstanding Year 6 learners.

## Thought for the Week

**'Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go.'** (Joshua 1:9 NIV)

Have you ever had to follow in someone else's footsteps? In most cases, it isn't very easy. In the Old Testament, there was a man called Joshua who had to take over from someone else, and they'd been in leadership for decades!

Moses had been leading the Jewish nation from Egypt, through the wilderness and to the edge of the promised land for 40 years and he was a tough act to follow. When Moses died, Joshua took over as leader. Now after such a long time leading the people relatively successfully, I'm sure it would have been a bit daunting for Joshua to take over from this "giant of faith".

Today's verse is taken from the book of Joshua and it comes at the very start of the book, just after Joshua had been commissioned. It says in the Bible that God spoke to him and told him to be strong and courageous. He also told him not to be afraid or discouraged.

I'm not sure about you, but when I am told not to be worried or anxious about something, it can often have the opposite effect - it can often make me feel more anxious and worried!

Sometimes a word of "encouragement" from someone, who tells you to stand up straight, to stop worrying and to face whatever's coming head on can have quite a negative effect. These people may not struggle with fear or anxiety, but just telling someone to "sort themselves out" isn't usually very helpful.

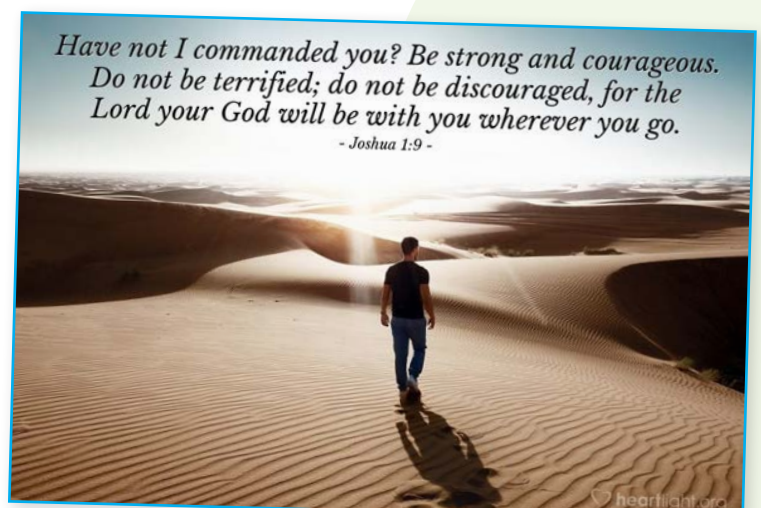
What's better is knowing that someone's got your back - that they are with you. While you're going through your difficult challenge or situation, are they thinking about you, or even maybe praying for you? They will be the person who will ask you how things are and also be the person on the other end of the phone when you need someone to sound off to.

These people make the real difference and often just knowing that they are there and that you can confide in them can give you the courage and strength you need.

Well fortunately for Joshua, God didn't just tell him to just stop worrying and get on with things. God told him that he would be with him wherever he went. Joshua knew that God had his back covered. He knew that he could come and talk to God about anything - the troubles and the joys, the struggles and the successes.

Knowing someone has got your back means a lot. For many people like Joshua, knowing God's got them means a whole lot more!

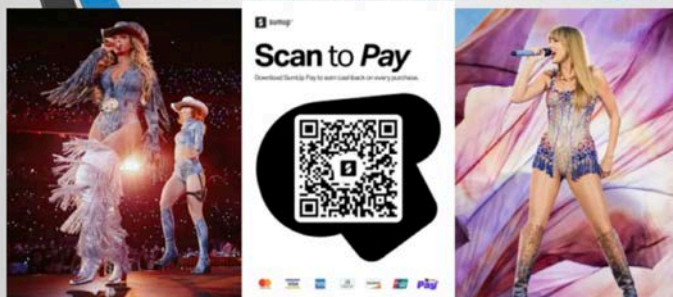

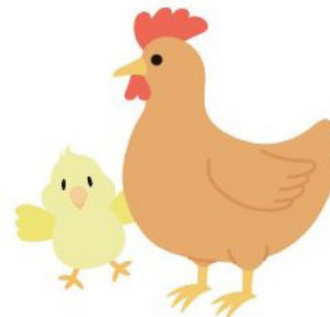
