Dear Parents and Carers,

What a glorious start to Friday morning; however, as I write the forecast is showers for this afternoon - another reminder that we need our children need to be prepared for all weathers. Please remember to send your child to school with both their coat and their water bottle.

Despite the very changeable weather, there has been only sunshine all week in school! I have been really struck by the purposeful, focused atmosphere in lessons and how

caring our children are outside. Overwhelmingly, our children report in recent surveys that behaviour is good and they know who to speak to if they are upset or worried, but please do continue to talk to your child at home about the importance of telling an adult if they are finding things difficult at play time. We do take a very firm approach to any kind of 'rough play' or unkindness, as safe and enjoyable play times and lunch times are perhaps the most important times of the day for all children.



#### **Books 2 Africa**

We have started boxing up the huge collection of books that we no longer need to send them to the charity: Books 2 Africa (<a href="https://books2africa.org">https://books2africa.org</a>). You may remember last year that we had an amazing response to our Amazon wish list to update our library catalogue and were able to completely overhaul the library. We are using ParentPay to reduce our handling of cash in school both to save time and to reduce the number of visitors to our school office.

We are now due to hold our parents evenings on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> November and Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> November and hope to be able to send out instructions for how to book appointments soon.

FOODS CONTAINING NUTS WILL HAVE TO BE REMOVED FROM CHILDRENS LUNCH BOXES. No fizzy drinks are allowed in school. Drinks bottles that children have in the class should only contain water.
