Year 2

We have hit the first week with a bang - Democracy week! In year 2 children have been reading and taking ideas from 'If I was a Prime Minister' in English, by the end of the week the children then adapted this to 'If I was a student councillor' and had a vote as to who they believe should represent them on the student council.

We also had a fantastic history workshop focussing on sources found in the local area. We were able to identify the uses of each source and we discussed which time period each piece was from. One question we had was 'How can these artefacts help us learn about history', throughout the session we built a knowledge of what life has been like in Midsomer Norton and Somerset for hundreds of years. The most interesting source we looked at was a hand axe which was hundreds of years old!

In science we made predictions about some halloween pumpkins and what they would look like at the end of this term and then at the end of next term!





Year 3

Wow, it's been a busy week yet again. We have been exploring all kinds of new topics in Gecko Class.

Firstly, we had a special visit from a Historian who helped us examine a census and find details about the people of Midsomer Norton over 100 years ago. This involved decoding the old handwriting and using deduction. He taught us how to recognise facts we know for certain and separate these from things we assume. Our Geckos behaved beautifully and responded very impressively to a range of questions and tasks.

Secondly, among all our other lessons, we explored the timeline and how enormous it is when we consider BC. Although we have introduced Prehistory as our new topic, we also revisited The Gunpowder Plot ahead of the end of week. Apparently, our Geckos have a fascination with all things gruesome as they had many questions about the torture and execution part! Naturally, we then discussed why such a plot was devised and how our government has changed since then. This leaves us with a solid foundation to build on throughout UK Parliament Week this week... I can't wait to see how our future leaders get on!
