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# Thought of the Week

# 'The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.' (John 1:5)

Today's verse was quoted by her late majesty Queen Elizabeth II during her Christmas message in 2015.

"It is true that the world has had to confront moments of darkness this year, but the Gospel of John contains a verse of great hope, often read at Christmas carol services: 'The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it'... Despite being displaced and persecuted throughout his short life, Christ's unchanging message was not one of revenge or violence but simply that we should love one another."

Some of us might say that this message is true, possibly even more true today than it was 7 years ago. We have lived through a pandemic, a war in Ukraine and more recently a fuel crisis and ever increasing food costs. Some days, the world can seem a very dark place.

During times like these, it is even more important that we do pull together and as Elizabeth's message says, we should simply love one another.

This has always been the message of the gospel. In the Bible, Jesus is clearly shown to be someone who served others and had time for people, even children and the people that were shunned by the rest of society.

Whatever we have to face in the next few weeks, or months, let's remember that we can make a difference in the lives of those around us by showing love and compassion. Who's day can you

brighten up? What can you do to make another person's day even better? How can you make a positive difference?



Let's remember the lives of both Elizabeth and Jesus and how both lived lives of service to others. Maybe theirs is an example for us.
