

Thought of the Week

"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing..."

(John 15:5)



'The True Vine' by Diane Hall

Have you had one of those days recently when there seems to be layers of things that go wrong. Everything starts out okay, and then one after another things happen that turn the whole day from good, to bad to worse.

I had one of those days last week, where from the evening before and into the next morning, things just weren't working out. Whenever I tried to fix things, nothing seemed to work. I remember feeling pretty lousy by the time the school day started and I didn't know what to do.

Fortunately we were starting the day with collective worship at the church and when Reverend Pitt spoke, he mentioned something that turned everything around. Although he didn't specifically mention today's verse, there was a picture of grapes on a vine and we were asked to 'plug into God'. I was instantly reminded of John 15 verse 5, where Jesus tells his followers that to be able to 'bear fruit' they needed to remain in him.

Now, call it coincidence if you want, but this verse keeps coming up. And again last week, I was being reminded that if I 'plugged into God', I would cope so much better than I had

been, trying to fix it on my own. It's often the last part of the verse, 'apart from me you can do nothing', that I keep on being reminded of. It's as if God is saying, you might think you can handle things by yourself, but why don't you talk to me and ask for my help. Why not talk to me before everything starts going wrong and then maybe things will continue being better.

It doesn't mean that all problems will miraculously disappear, but maybe by asking for help I would deal with the problems better and be able to put things in perspective. And if I can get a verse through 'divine inspiration', maybe I can get inspired with ideas of how to deal with my problems as well.

This verse also reminds me of our value this term - koinonia. Next week, the vision and values team will be sharing a collective worship all about koinonia, which means community or fellowship. As a school, we can work together to 'bear fruit'. If we work together, surely we will manage so much better than if we all work in isolation.

SO, if you believe in God, maybe this week is the week to ask for help before you need it. Prayer could be the solution before the problem happens, rather than after it's already happened. If not, then maybe this week you can look for ways to work together with others. How can you help those in your community or koinonia? You're more likely to achieve things together than apart.
