

Thought for the Week



'Then Mary took about a pint of pure nard, an expensive perfume; she poured it on Jesus' feet and wiped his feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume.' (John 12:3 NIV)

I consider this week's verse and passage one of the most beautiful moments in the whole of scripture. A version of the event is included in all four Gospels, but it is only in <u>John's Gospel</u> that the woman is named as Mary, the sister of Lazarus.



Whichever version you read, the woman who anoints Jesus is criticized by those in the room with them. Often this was Jesus' disciples, complaining because the perfume could have been sold and the money given to the poor. Although what they say might be noble and true, would they have actually carried this out? One of the disciples there was Judas, who may well have had other ideas of how to spend the money.

What makes this moment so special is that the woman isn't at all concerned with what the other people think. All she wants to do is demonstrate her love for Jesus. Whether this was out of gratitude for bringing her brother back to life, or in response to being forgiven, she doesn't mind if she looks foolish or is jeered at by others, she carries on regardless.

If we really love someone, we may go to great lengths to show it. We might buy them an expensive gift, or treat them to a holiday or a day trip. We might tell them in a card or share a song that says what we are finding difficult to say. Some of us might create something to show them how much we love them. But often if we really mean it, we won't stop to consider what others might think of us.

This is often the case for Christians. They love God and they want to tell him. And sometimes they want to tell others about it as well. And yes, often they can look a bit silly. Singing songs to God, raising their hands, praying and willing to get immersed under water to show that they want to follow Jesus' example in life. Often, it's a lack of understanding that makes people want to smile or laugh, but surely we can all understand what it means to do something out of love for someone. Unlike people, God is spirit and so we can't see him and so this makes it more

difficult. But this is why Christians look to Jesus as the image of the invisible God. He came so we could understand better what God was like.

This week, take a moment to think about those people that you love and consider how you could demonstrate your love for them. And the next time you see someone looking foolish doing something for God, just remember Mary in today's passage. Remember...it's a demonstration of love!
