Year 6 SATs Week

I would like to start this week's newsletter by saying well done to our three Year 6 girls for their hard work in the assessments they have taken. It is never easy to sit exams at this age but all three embraced the week and put in their full effort into the English and mathematics papers.

Class Structures next year

We have spent much time looking at pupil numbers for next year and exploring the many options for how the classes will be split from September. We will have just under 100 pupils from Reception to Year 6 and the task is to find the best way to fit them into four classes. This discussion has taken place initially within our senior leadership team and then has also been discussed at Local Governing Body meetings.

As a result of this we have come up with the following structure:

Kingfishers: Reception and Year 1 (approx. 21)
Starlings: Year 2 and Year 3 (approx. 26)
Goldfinches: Year 4 and Year 5 (approx. 24)
Swallows: Year 5 and Year 6 (approx. 24)

As you can see this means that we will have to split the children in the current Year 4 class between Goldfinches and Swallows next year. They are the largest cohort of children we have had in our school and we have managed to keep them together for their first five years, but to avoid class sizes of over 30, they will be split next year. The following year (when they reach Year 6) they will come back together as one class.

The rationale behind which children will go into which class will be based on a number of things including age, friendships and how well the teachers think they will work collaboratively. The children in Year 5 will also be brought back together for some subjects, such as maths and science, where they will be taught as a cohort. The staff will meet at the beginning of Term 6 to make these decisions and we will then share who will be in each class with parents. We will also offer the opportunity for parents of children in those year groups to speak with us and ask any further questions, a date for which will be set after the half term break.
