



We will be sending out school reports by email during the afternoon today. Each teacher is sending their own reports so you may receive them at different times if you have children in more than one class. The format and content is similar to other years but with slightly less detail in some areas and no official end of key stage assessments as they did not take place. The attainment, progress and effort scores are indicative of how the children were working in school before they left at the end of March, as well as any observations since then. We have removed the pupil and parent comment boxes, but should you want to respond to the report please email back your thoughts – and those of your child – to the class teacher. For children in Class 4 the reports will come from the office email, so please respond to that.

I am also sending out a comprehensive letter following the correspondence from Alun Williams earlier this week. This outlines all the plans in place for September. Our risk assessment will be uploaded on to our website next week as well. As you are aware, the situation and therefore our planning is still dynamic and changes may need to happen before we return in September, which we will keep you informed about.

You should have received a questionnaire earlier this week designed by the Trust to gauge parents' perception of their child's readiness for school return. We hope you have time to fill this in by the end of next week so we can prepare for teaching and learning in September. If your child is in Year 6, your responses will be sent to their secondary school.

Finally we have arranged a short Leavers' Service for Year 6 on Wednesday afternoon at 2:00pm in the church. Unfortunately due to current regulations we can only invite one adult to attend with each Year 6 child. However other adults are welcome to come along and wait outside the church to see their children at the end.

We are in school all of next week so please do get in touch if you have any questions about September.

- **Breakfast Club** – Thank you to those who have responded to our email about Breakfast Club in Term 1. We are now able to advise that the club will re-open at the beginning of the new term. Please place and pay for your bookings via ParentPay as soon as possible so we are able to plan for provisions and space. A simple breakfast will be provided followed by supervised childcare prior to the children going to class. Children will need to be dropped off at the school gate at 8:00am at which point they will be taken to the classroom.
- **Dinner Menu** – There is a new dinner menu now available for September for children in Classes 1 and 2 and those in Key Stage 2 who are eligible for Free School Meals, which can be found on the website.
- **Dinner Booking** – Meal bookings are now available on ParentPay for Years 1, 2 & Free School Meal pupils in Years 3-6. Reception Year may also book meals now for meals from 14/09/20). Packed lunches should be brought to school by all other children in Years 3-6 as is outlined in the school arrangements for September. Children in Classes 1 & 2 can bring a pack lunch if they prefer.
- **End of year gifts** – should you be planning on giving a small gift to a pupil or member of staff, may we ask that this is done on Wednesday 15th July. If children have gifts for their teacher they may bring these in at the beginning of the day, whilst gifts for their friends should be exchanged on the ramp at the end of the day (brought to the school by the parents at the end of the day).
