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Mr Marvin's Thought of the Week

'By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible.' (Hebrews 11:3)



We all know the story of Goldilocks and the three bears. While the bears were out for a walk, Goldilocks helps herself to their porridge, chairs and beds, testing each one in turn until she finds the one that's "juuuuuust right".

While Goldilocks could learn a thing or two about manners, there's something to be said for things being just right. Like Earth for example. It's in just the right spot for life – a place scientists call the Goldilocks Zone (or the Habitable Zone for you more scientific types). Earth isn't too close to the Sun (which would burn us to a crisp) or too far away (which would turn our planet into a giant ice cube).

It is believed that in the Milky Way alone that there are 12-17 billion planets that are in this "Goldilocks" orbit, but these are only planets which are in the right position for water to remain liquid and this is also dependent on the right atmospheric pressure and water being present in the first place.

According to 'Learn Astronomy HQ', 'In order for an advanced species to evolve and emerge as an intelligent, cognitive being such as humans - numerous other Goldilocks factors need to occur. It's not just about the water. Fortunately for us, we have that advantage. Here are the top 15 Goldilocks factors that make life on Earth as we know it possible.'

- 1. Proximity to the Sun allowing liquid water
- 2. The size and composition of Earth as a Rocky Planet
- 3. Stability of Earth's atmosphere and chemical composition
- 4. The Magnetosphere
- 5. Consistency of temperatures on Earth
- 6. Diversity of Life
- 7. Earth's moon
- 8. Stability of the Sun as a star
- 9. The Ozone Layer
- 10. The amount of water on Earth
- 11. Jupiter as a Solar System vacuum cleaner for asteroids, comets and meteors
- 12. The stability of the Solar System
- 13. Our location in the Milky Way
- 14. The Stability of the Galaxy
- 15. The Stability of our Quantum Universe

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Because of the stability of the Sun, the Solar System, the Galaxy and our Universe, maybe it could be said that we are living in a Goldilocks universe as well. Even so, the fact that Earth meets all these conditions is so amazing that some astronomers have estimated the chances of there being another planet like ours in the universe to be around 1 in 700 quintillion (1 in 700,000,000,000,000,000). These chances have also been compared to there being an explosion in a supermarket leaving you with a perfectly cooked three-course meal!

For many people, these statistics are good evidence for a creator, someone who first put the stars and planets into place. Many people can see how the belief in a Big Bang could be like God saying 'Let there be light'. In the book of Hebrews, the writer lists some of the examples of great faith in the Bible and what was achieved as a result of these acts of faith. One that is included is a person's faith in the universe being formed at God's command, so that was is seen was made from what was invisible. Surely this is what Albert Einstein's theorised when he talked about matter and energy being interchangeable and this verse was written almost 2000 years ago!

One thing that the writer of Hebrews does say is that it is by faith that someone believes that God created the universe from nothing, but although faith is needed I would argue there's a lot of coincidences that seem to be pointing in the right direction.
