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## **Thought of the Week**

'For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes.' (Romans 1:16)



So what is the 'gospel'? You've probably heard that word before, but maybe you don't know what it is.

Well, put simply, 'gospel' means 'good news'. And according to the Bible, this 'good news' is that Jesus Christ, the Son of God, died for everyone's sins and rose again, eternally triumphant, so that there is now no condemnation, or punishment, for those who believe, but everlasting joy.

Now lots of us have a problem with this 'good news'. Either, we think we don't need saving it offends those of us who are moral and who think we're good enough to not need saving. Or maybe we don't like being called a "sinner", we don't like to think that maybe people aren't innately good. Or it could be that we don't like to hear that only Jesus can save - it offends those of us who think that all spiritual paths lead to the same place.

But if we can put aside these arguments for a moment and take another look at this gospel message, we'll see that it's pretty strong stuff. What if there was truth in it?

Our verse today states that the gospel *is* the power of God. Not that the gospel comes *with* power, but it actually *is* power. It says that the gospel message is the power of God in verbal form, and it has the power to change, transform and give life to people. It saves them.

Today's verse also states that it is for everyone who believes. The gospel, and therefore

salvation, can only be received by faith, by believing that it is true. We don't have to do anything special, or try to be good enough, we just have to believe in who Jesus was and what he did. And we no longer need to believe in our own innate goodness either.

If we take this all onboard, we can see why Paul, who wrote the letter to the church in Rome, also stated that he wasn't ashamed of the gospel.

It can be difficult for those of us who do believe in Jesus, his death, his resurrection and in his salvation, because so many other people don't believe in it - and often think those of us who do, might be a bit misguided (to say the least).

I hope this isn't the case and that you are able to take a moment to grasp and understand just what this 'good news' is telling us. And then to see that this 'gospel message' is the power of God and can be relied upon to bring salvation to everyone who believes in it.

Or you could just try and ignore it.

Often though, these things don't go away.
