Mr Marvin's Thought of the Week



'God saved you by his grace when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God.'

(Ephesians 2:8)



Many people think that being a Christian is all about following the rules. In fact aren't all religions about following (or not following) rules?

From the outside, it can often seem like that. All religions have rules and guidelines that believers are expected to follow – the 5 pillars of Islam, the Hindu dharma, the Jewish Torah and Jesus' two greatest commandments.

But guess what...we all mess up. Even "religious" people get it wrong and make mistakes. We all know how difficult it is to follow all the rules all the time – unless you always drive below or at the speed limit and you've never taken 11 items to the 10 items and less till (do these even exist anymore!)

For Christians though it is different. Christians are people who are aware that they get it wrong, that they are not perfect and that they cannot sort things out on their own. They need each other, yes, but they also recognise that they follow Christ because they need him even more.

Christians believe that Jesus died on the cross and that he was punished in our place for all the wrong things we have done and still do. Because of this, Christians believe that they are saved by grace.

Grace is one of those wonderful words that we don't hear used much anymore. There are several meanings, but in the Bible it means 'the free and unmerited favour of God'. God chooses, because of the cross, to view us with love, favour and most importantly forgiveness.

Christians, like many of us, will try to do the right thing and follow the rules. This makes sense. That's why rules are there. If everyone followed the rules all the time, the world would be a much better and happier place. No one overtaking you dangerously on a bend, no one taking things that don't belong to them and no one trying to cut in when queuing (that is more to do with social etiquette than rules, but it still makes us mad!).

But here's the good news. For Christians they believe that God knows we will mess up and that we have messed up, which is why he died in our place. Although Christians, with God's help, will try and follow the rules, because of his grace, they can always receive God's forgiveness – it is a gift from God.



God saved you by His grace when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God. Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it.
