Arbor - Parent App

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Thought for the Week

"Here is a simple rule of thumb for behavior: Ask yourself what you want people to do for you; then grab the initiative and do it for them!" (Luke 6:31 - The Message)

Over the last couple of weeks, we have been looking at what it means to be 'made in the image of God'. This concept that is championed by the Bible, has led to the development of values and principles like equality, compassion, consent, enlightenment, science, freedom and progress. Although this may seem unlikely, this is because our Western values and moral frameworks are interwoven with Christian principles, which is 'a legacy that persists irrespective of individual convictions or religious adherence'

(<u>https://www.bookey.app/book/the-air-we-breathe</u>). If you want to know more, I recommend giving <u>this book</u> a read.



So, if we are 'made in the image of God' or our whole society is at least based on this concept, whether we believe it or not, what should we do about it?

First and foremost, consider how we treat each other, including ourselves. If we believe each one of us has a purpose and were created with inherent value and dignity, surely we need to treat each other with value and dignity.

This can be difficult, especially when it's the driver who just cut us up or that neighbour who's dog just won't stop barking. What about the difficult in-law who really gets up your nose? Or that colleague at work who won't stop going on about their holiday, or their family or their problems?

Well, first of all, consider your own position. Are you sometimes the annoying driver or the difficult neighbour? Can you get up other people's noses? Do you sometimes go on a bit about your family, your holiday or your issues? We all have a tendency to do or say things to make our lives easier. We all just want to get by in life as happily and as easily as we can. That will sometimes mean we will get other peoples back up. And guess what, other people will sometimes get our back up too!

Next, we might need to consider the other person. Is there a reason why they were driving badly? Are they in a hurry? Have they had a difficult morning? What about the neighbour's dog? Do they have to work and can't find a dogsitter? Is their dog distressed for some reason?

That in-law might find you equally annoying. Just because you have loads in common with your partner, it doesn't mean you're going to love spending time with all of their family. You just might be too different and have completely different interests and priorities. The same goes for work colleagues I suppose. Just because you have the same line manager, doesn't mean you are going to be best friends.

The important thing is to treat them with respect and dignity and remember that they are a fellow human being, who has purpose, value and meaning. They like you are worthy. And the good thing is, if you acknowledge this and treat others in this way, they will hopefully (maybe not at first) treat you similarly. This is the reason for our verse this week - 'treat others just as you want to be treated'.
