SIAMS - Parental Notice

As you may already know, as a church school, we are inspected by the National Society on behalf of the Church of England every few years in line with Section 48 of the Education Act 2005. This SIAMS inspection makes judgements on religious education, collective worship, and pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural education. This coming September, the SIAMS Framework is changing and the inspections will look a little different.

These key changes are:

- grades will be replaced by one of two statements
- schools will need a theologically rooted Christian vision
- inspection questions will focus on impact instead of lists of criteria
- the school's context will play a greater role
- there will be a greater emphasis on the MATs accountability

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Thought of the Week

'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.' (Hebrews 13:8)

If you've not come across the series 'The Chosen' on Netflix, then I thoroughly recommend you take a look. And what better time than over the summer holidays!

It's a series about the life of Jesus, created, written, directed and produced by Dallas Jenkins by Angel Studios.

The series focuses around the people that were chosen to live and work with Jesus, the twelve disciples. But the series also includes some of the women that may well have travelled with him - some of which are mentioned in the Bible but are not included as being among his disciples. A Jewish rabbi in those days wouldn't have included women in their group of followers and this is commented on in the series, so it is very revolutionary that some of Jesus' followers were female.

What's interesting about this series is the way that Jesus' and the disciples' humanity is portrayed. Jesus, played by Jonathan Roumie, often makes little jokes and comments that are genuinely funny and the disciples are shown in all their true colours. Included in the group is Matthew, beautifully performed by Paras Patel. Matthew was a former tax collector and in the series he is portrayed as being neurodiverse, which provides a really valid explanation as to why a Jew might 'betray' his people and work for the Romans collecting taxes. Whether you are a Bible scholar or someone who has very little Bible knowledge at all, it is a real treat to watch an historical drama which focuses on a diverse group of mixed up individuals and the way they become a unit. They are presently filming the fourth series and although Netflix is only showing the first one, the others can be watched easily over the internet or on a phone app, all for free.

After watching one particular episode where Jesus was teaching The Sermon on the Mount, it reminded me of today's verse from Hebrews 13, that tells us that Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever. It doesn't matter how he is portrayed in films or in television series, or which translation of the Bible you read, it is still the same man.

For Christians all over the world, this is a real encouragement, especially in a world where everything is constantly changing. To know there is one person who can be relied upon and who will never leave or forsake you whatever happens, makes a tangible difference.

My recommendation is to take a look at this series - <u>https://www.angel.com/watch/the-chosen</u> and don't give up after episode one as Jesus only appears in the last two minutes!
