Class News:


Over the last two weeks we have been really busy in Badger Class. We have started our new writing unit based on the text "Traction Man". There was some very complex vocabulary such as warfare, perspex, envelop and sub-aqua. The children are trying hard to use these words in their writing. We have also learnt how to use commas in a list. It's a very tricky skill so any help at home with writing shopping lists etc would be really helpful.

In Maths we are working hard on our addition and subtraction skills. Having a secure understanding of number bonds to 10 will help children in this unit so practice of this at home would also be really useful! We have been using techniques involving making 10 first to support us with our additions.

Our new Art focus is on *maps*. We drew our own map of an area special to us using a range of mediums (pastels, crayons, pencils). They didn't need to be accurate and the children could work creatively to produce some lovely abstract work.

Finally, we celebrated **Remembrance Day** on Friday which links to our History work. We have a greater understanding of what life was like for people on the frontline and at home and know the importance of showing respect to those who made big sacrifices for us.


In Art we have made a poppy wreath out of recycled plastic bottles to commemorate **Remembrance Day**. It looks really effective and the children worked very carefully on this important task.

The children asked a lot of interesting questions about what they would like to discover as we go through this topic.

Our School Milk Scheme

Dear Parent or Guardian,

School Milk Services Ltd has been working in partnership with your Local Education Authority since 2001 to deliver fresh milk to schools across the South West.

We provide fresh milk to your school which is free of charge for children under the age of 5, funded by the Department of Health under the Nursery Milk Scheme. Once children reach the age of 5, this funding is withdrawn.

We offer a milk service for children over the age of 5. Each child that is registered will receive a 189ml portion of semi-skimmed milk at the morning break period. The cost of this service is less than £2 per week* and you can pay in either one, two or four instalments across the school year.

Registering

- You can register your child before or after their 5th Birthday by visiting our website at <u>www.schoolmilkservices.co.uk</u> or scanning the QR code on the right:
 - If you are registering <u>before</u> your child's 5th Birthday, you can either choose to make a payment at the time of registering, or you can ask for a reminder to be sent 4 weeks before your child's birthday.
 - If you are registering <u>after</u> your child's 5th Birthday, payment will be requested immediately.



Register by Thursday at 12:00 for your child's milk to start on the following Monday.

Generous friends from around the country and abroad continue to support the school.

In addition to the school there is now also a nursery school, a farm, a sick bay and a guesthouse. We actively update our supporters about the children in Uganda and what has been happening
