## Hedgehogs



#### **Class News:**

What an exciting first few weeks of term 2 we've had in Hedgehogs! We mixed different colours with lots of glitter to make bright and colourful fireworks pictures for November the 5th, and the children shared with us how they celebrated outside of nursery. We had fun using the musical instruments to make loud noises like the fireworks, practising stopping and playing the instruments to a beat.

We held **Remembrance Day** by making and hanging poppies on the tree, watching some of the London parades and talking about the soldiers and why we remember them.

We've spent so much time enjoying the outdoors in all the weather, the forest school area looks so colourful covered in leaves at the moment. The children have so enjoyed exploring, finding bugs, climbing the trees and listening to the rain. We even had a dinosaur treasure hunt based around our focus book "Worrysaurus" about a little lost dinosaur. Our other focus books were "Room on the Broom"; the children enjoyed collecting sticks and making their own brooms to ride on, and "10 Little Monkeys", which supported our Maths focus: counting, recognising numbers, and for our older children subitising up to three.

During sound time, we've been learning our sound and word of the week, playing "Silly Soup" and "Match the Sound." With our younger children, we've been practising tuning into sounds on "Sound Walks," where they explore what noises they can make in the environment.

The children have been very excited to begin practising for our **Nativity** this week. They are already singing along to the words and copying the actions, showing such wonderful confidence! We can't wait to share this with our families at the end of the term!

The children are really enjoying their hands-on science experiments and are forming hypotheses and asking really interesting questions.

**Class News:** 

It's been a brilliant start to Term 2 and it was great to be able to meet up with so many parents at our recent Parent/Teacher Meetings and share all of the fantastic news regarding how well our cohort of Year 4/5 Lions are getting on.

Some of our recent highlights have included our new topic in Science, where we have been investigating the best materials to help keep our cups of tea warm! We found that covering cups in wool prevented heat loss the most which must mean that wool is a good thermal insulator.

In Music, this term we are learning about Blues music. Did you know that Blues music originated from music sung by black Africans who were taken to be slaves in South America, North America and the Caribbean islands? The

slaves sang to help them with their hard work and to keep up their spirits. We are learning the chords to play the 12-bar blues on the glockenspiels.

We have really enjoyed beginning learning a new sport in PE. We have begun to develop our hockey skills and there is some really impressive natural talent being demonstrated by our Lions, particularly with the tricky techniques required for reverse stick dribbling and receiving a pass at speed.

Finally, well done to everyone for continuing to read so regularly at home. We are having to hand out so many certificates each week as our class zooms through this year's Reading Challenge. Fantastic effort, everyone!

It's been a wonderful start to what is certainly a very busy term for our Eagles. The children have returned with such maturity and positivity, tackling assessments and the introduction of SATs homework with resilience. We are incredibly proud of how calmly and confidently they have settled back into routines, showing that they are more than ready for the challenges ahead.

In Writing, Eagles have been innovating the first chapter of "Goodnight Mister Tom". They have impressed us with their thoughtful character descriptions, carefully chosen speech and the increasingly confident use of hyphenated words and semi-colons to enhance their narratives. It has been a joy to see them experimenting with style and structure to make this well-loved story their own.

During Guided Reading, we have been sharpening our VIPERS skills while diving deeper into "Goodnight Mister Tom". Although it is a complex and emotionally rich text, the Eagles have thrown themselves into it with real enthusiasm. Their discussions have been thoughtful and mature and it's clear they are fully absorbed in the story.

In Science, Eagles have started their new topic on classifying living things. They have loved getting outdoors to explore the natural world, discovering plants and creatures before using classification keys to sort them into groups. Their curiosity and teamwork have made these sessions particularly enjoyable.

In PE, Eagles have been developing their netball skills, focusing on finding space and mastering footwork-something that many find quite tricky at first! Their understanding of the different passes is becoming increasingly secure and they are buzzing with excitement about putting their skills into practice in our upcoming mini class matches.

I am incredibly proud of the Eagles and everything they have achieved so far this term. Their determination, teamwork and positivity shine through every day. We still have so much more to explore and accomplish, and I can't wait to see what the rest of the term brings.

## Great Timsbury Bake Off - What a competition!


The Great Timsbury Bake Off Success!

## **Thought for the Week**

#### 'Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!' (Philippians 4:4)

Sometimes it can be hard to find things to be joyful about. When it's November and the days are shorter and the weather is miserable and it's started getting really cold, it can bring a lot of us down.

This time of year can be difficult for many of us. About 1 in 15 of us are affected by Seasonal Affective Disorder or SAD, but I imagine many more of us will still find the effects of winter difficult. That might be why so many of us are putting up our Christmas decorations earlier each year!

People in Denmark are well known for embracing the coziness that winter can bring, so much so that it has become part of their cultural identity. They have even named it. *Hygge* (pronounced "hoo-gah") is defined as a quality of coziness and comfortable conviviality that engenders a feeling of contentment and wellbeing. They use candles and warm lighting, eat comfort food and spend time with loved ones, to create a *hyggelig* atmosphere.

This does sound a bit like our seasonal period, but it is certainly not something that is restricted to a week or two. Maybe this is why we're so keen to start our Christmas festivities earlier each year. We want to experience *hygge*.

Whatever you choose to do, it is important to do things that you enjoy, things that you can 'rejoice' in. Paul, who wrote the letter to the Philippians made it clear to them that we should rejoice in the Lord. Many Christians around the world have found this phrase so helpful. When they are feeling weighed down by life and by all the difficulties and darkness, they can remind themselves to rejoice in what God has done for them and to remember how much he loves them. This is really something (or somebody) that they can rejoice in.

But for some of us, this won't be the case. If not, what is it in your life that gives you joy? Family? Friends? A book in your favourite chair? Early morning walks? Whatever it is, make time for it and whatever you do, remember to rejoice!
