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Thought of the Week

"You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbour and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven."

(Matthew 5: 43-45)



This year, our school has a new vision. Farrington Gurney is 'a place where all can flourish, find fulfilment and experience life in all its fullness.'

We want and believe this for all the children and adults in our school community and we believe that this is possible by embedding our four key learning values - Compassion, Agility, Responsibility and Engagement - CARE.

We have linked these key learning values to our overarching Christian values of love, trust, forgiveness, perseverance, hope, justice, courage and koinonia. Engagement we believe is linked very closely with courage and koinonia. It takes courage to keep on asking questions and to be curious and if we are engaged and interested, we will take an interest in those around us, those who are in our community or koinonia.

As part of our engaged learning value, it says that 'we look after each other and challenge unfairness'. Who does this include? Does that mean we are meant to look after those people who we find difficult and challenging as well as our best friends?

In today's verse, Jesus talks about loving our enemy as well as our neighbour. Although most people don't use the word enemy to describe people who they don't get along with, these are the sorts of people Jesus is referring to. Can we look out for and even look after those people who rub us up the wrong way? What about those people who intentionally get on our nerves?

Jesus had his fair share of "enemies". Many of the religious leaders didn't like him because he challenged the way they did things, many people who came from Jerusalem didn't like the fact that he was a Northerner from Galilee ("Can anything good come from Nazareth" - John 1:46) and the Romans weren't keen on him because he disturbed the peace. People disliked him so much that they demanded that he be crucified. So he understood what it would mean to love and take care of your enemies.

If we want to show that we are engaged and interested in someone else, we often need to take the time to find out more about them. Maybe that person you just can't bear just needs someone to take a moment to listen to them and understand them. Maybe they annoy you so much because they are hurting and don't know how to "engage" with others? Would it hurt to strike up a conversation and ask them how they are? This might be exactly what they need. It might be exactly what you need too.
