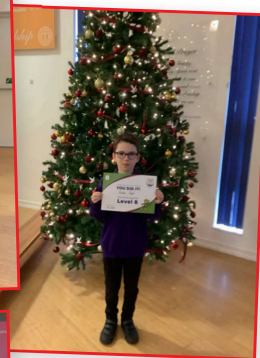


Outside Achievements

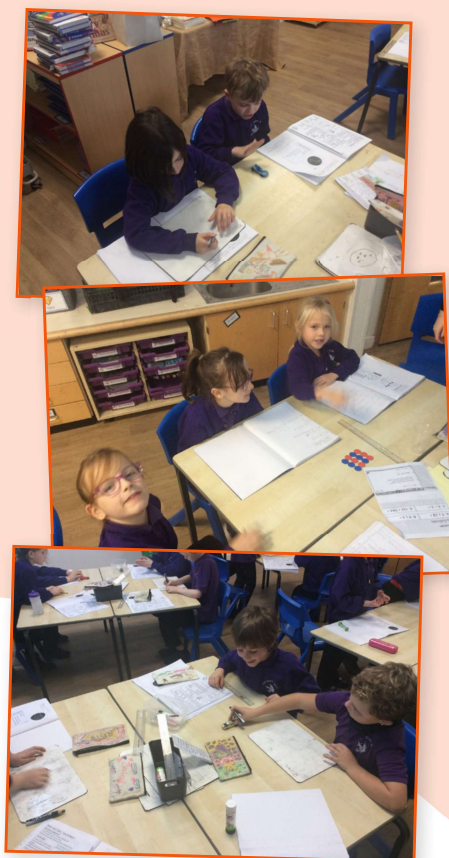
have been writing instructions on how the Grinch stole Christmas!

Class News:

Redwood Class



In Year 6, we have come to the end of several of our topics over the last couple of weeks. In Science, we concluded our unit on *light* by exploring how we see colour through Isaac Newton's *theory of colour*. As part of our learning, we also investigated how rainbows are formed through the process of refraction and the separation of light into the seven colours of the spectrum.

In History, our topic on *World War Two* has also drawn to a close. Since our visit to the local museum at Midsomer Norton Train Station, the children have been learning about key events from the Second World War including the Battle of Dunkirk, the Battle of Britain and the Blitz. We have also explored the different types of air-raid shelters used across the country to keep people safe during bombing raids.

Thought of the week



Our thought this week, discussed in class, really linked with kindness shown by our Trinity pupils. We took time to reflect and think about what we currently do and what other ways we can show kindness. We also remembered the power of a smile.

What does kindness look like?

This winter, a charity called Small Acts of Kindness has sourced, packed and distributed over 10,000 'Warm in Winter' gift bags across Hertfordshire and Bedfordshire. Each bag includes things to keep people warm, like blankets, socks and hot drinks. The project aims to bring comfort to elderly and vulnerable people in the colder months. It shows that small acts of kindness can make a big difference in someone's life.

Our pupils at Trinity, for the past few years have been demonstrating small acts of kindness through their support of Lizzie's Soup Run who provide food and resources to the homeless people

on the streets of Bath. Classes support packing tea bags, coffee sachets, sugar and other bits into packs to be added to the hot meals and dried foods handed out weekly. As Mrs Jones shared during our Christmas Service, Trinity pupils have currently put together 2,500 hot drinks packs so far this year and our harvest donations further supported the charity's work. These small acts of kindness are hugely appreciated and make a big difference on a cold day to an unknown person.

- What are some small acts of kindness we can do at home, at school, or in our community?

Arbor / School Grid

Thank you to all parents for embracing the change from ParentPay to **Arbor** and **SchoolGrid**. A reminder that school meals are chosen and paid for via SchoolGrid, whereas everything else is on Arbor (wraparound care, clubs, trips etc). You will need to have a balance on account in order to book some clubs and wraparound care.

The deadline for booking school lunches is still Thursday at 10pm for the following week. If you have not booked in advance, you will need to provide a packed lunch for your child - there are no exceptions to this as we do not have food in school anymore. This new system has been tried and tested in other schools within the Trust, and is much more reliable and user-friendly - meals will not be cancelled, so if a booking is not there, it is because it hasn't been made. Please remember to make your bookings for the first week back before the deadline of January 1st.

Arbor will be how we communicate with parents going forward - it is therefore essential that you have notifications set up on either the Parent Portal or (preferably) the app so you don't miss out on information about club cancellations, trips, events, important announcements, etc.

It's been a very busy time getting the new systems set up and learning how they work, so **thank you** for bearing with us whilst we ironed out the initial quirks!
