Can I take this opportunity to remind you of the invitation to join us for our annual **Harvest Service**. This is a wonderful occasion for our school community to give thanks for the food we have and to think of those less fortunate. The service will take place at St Giles Church, Leigh on Mendip, with Robins, Kingfishers and Starlings at 9 to 10am and Goldfinches and Swallows at 10 to 11am.

To truly embed a lifelong love of reading and see the maximum academic benefit, we strongly encourage all children to read at home **at least 5 times every week.** This doesn't have to mean sitting down with their school book for a full hour! Even 10-15 minutes of reading a comic, a recipe, a magazine, or a book of their choice makes a huge difference. For Key Stage 1 children, please ensure you sign their reading record/diary each time, for the older children they can write in their own daily comments but we do ask that a parent checks and signs it weekly. By now your child could have received their first 25 read certificate in celebration assembly and chosen a book as a reward. We want to give a massive congratulations to the many children who have already reached their **25 Reads** milestone!

We love to celebrate your children and make them feel special on their birthday! As a small birthday treat, children are invited to come to school wearing their **own clothes** on their actual birthday. If your child's birthday falls on a day when their class has PE, they can wear their own clothes on the **day before** or the **day after** their birthday to ensure they have the correct kit for their PE lesson. If your child's birthday falls over a weekend can we ask that they wear their own clothes on the **Friday before** their birthday. We want to make sure no one misses out, so children who had their birthday over the **Summer Holidays** or at the very **start of this term** (before today) can wear their own clothes next Friday 10th.

News from the Classrooms



We are continuing our topic of Autumn this week. We are reading the book *Don't Hog the Hedge* and learning about hibernation and sharing. We have also been enjoying our mud kitchen outside in the sunshine making foam and sand cocktails.





This week, the Kingfishers worked very hard in phonics and maths. The reception class learned new sounds (ck, e,u,r) and explored how to make ABAB patterns. The year ones are also learning new alternative sounds like (ai-ay, ow-ou, oi-oy, ee-ea). We also learned that different people, cultures and religions believe in the story of creation and others have different beliefs.





Starling Class are loving their experiments at the moment in science. This week, we were testing the strength of a variety of materials and recording our results. We then discussed the suitability of materials for different purposes.





This week in PSHE, Goldfinch class have been learning all about rewards and consequences. They enjoyed discussing the different rewards people receive and why they may get those rewards. They also discussed the purpose of rules and the consequences people may face if rules are broken.






