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### Thought of the Week

'But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him.' (Luke 15:20)

If you didn't know already, today's verse is taken from a parable Jesus told called The Lost Son; sometimes known as The Prodigal Son. If you don't remember the whole story, just find a child in Class 2 and they should be able to fill you in.

The story focuses on the value of forgiveness, one of our school's overarching values and part of our school vision. In the story, the son has asked for his share of his father's wealth that he would receive when his father died. It was as if he was wanting to skip ahead to when he can have his father's money without actually having his father, behaving as if he was dead.

After this scandalous behaviour, he then leaves home and squanders his new found wealth on "wild living", until it is all gone. At this point, the son decides it would be a good idea to go home, hoping that he will at least be able to take up employment as a servant in his father's house.

Now, there have been times in all of our lives where we have had to show forgiveness. Someone hasn't cleaned up after themselves at home, or maybe a family member breaks something that has sentimental value. Maybe a friend has said something really hurtful and it leaves us feeling upset and angry.

Forgiveness is never easy and often we want to hold onto the anger and bitterness. But who actually suffers here, the person who hasn't been forgiven or the person who doesn't forgive. Often we feel so much better when we choose to forgive the other person. We don't want them to get away with whatever it is they have done, but do we really want to be bound up in bitterness and resentment? Are we punishing them or ourselves?

But just for a moment, let's take a look at the father's response. He was consciously looking out for his son to return, seeing him while he was still a long way off. When the father recognises his son, he is filled with compassion and runs to meet him. In this culture, it was considered indignant for older men to run, but the father had no regard for this. He then threw his arms around him and kissed him and then went even further, giving him sandals, a ring and the best robe. If all this wasn't enough, he even threw a party for him and killed the "fattened calf", which was reserved for special occasions. This father knew how to forgive.

For Christians around the world, this is a story with a special or hidden meaning. Jesus wanted to show just how much God the Father loves each and every one of us. Even when we go off and do our own thing, forgetting all about him and not caring about others, he still loves us. If we are willing to say sorry and turn back, he's there welcoming us with open arms. What an example of forgiveness.
