We enjoyed two lovely harvest festivals at St Giles' Church this week, welcoming many of you who joined us in hearing about harvest from all of the children, with fantastic singing as well. We're sure you were still humming away to the Harvest Samba late into the evening! Thank you to everyone who sent in donations; these have been collected by the Somer Valley Foodbank and will be distributed to those who are in most need of them as we move into the winter months.

Yesterday we held a meeting with lan Groves to look at breakfast club and after school provision now that we have been back in school for a term. Breakfast club numbers are relatively low (often only 3 or 4 children) but we will keep this going as we know how important it is to those families who need it. We would hope that over time there may be a few more children joining, especially as this now a fixed provision. After school club with lan's team has proved to be very successful on some days (up to 15 or 16), but not so much on others and as such we are having to make a few changes. We are finding that numbers are not yet near what we were hoping for based on the initial questionnaires that were sent out. If this is for any particular reason, then please let us know, as we really want to keep the club going as much as possible. The Friday sessions have not proved at all popular and therefore lan will not be able to continue with these in Term 2. The rest of the clubs will carry on to the same times as this term, but with a few changes. Firstly each evening will be themed so that children can enjoy a wide range of activities.

## Monday - Archery Club (late pick up available)

Learn to become the next Robin Hood or Rapunzel with our amazing archery equipment designed by Archery GB. The children will have the opportunity to learn new skills using real bows and rubber arrowheads.

### Tuesday - Arts and Crafts (late pick up available)

The children will enjoy drawing, creating and making amazing projects throughout the term.

### Wednesday - Christmas Club (late pick up available)

Everything Christmas! The children will play Christmas themed games, crafts, baking and much more!

## Thursday - Lego, Knex and board games club (late pick up available)


As well as making models with Lego and Knex, the children will also be given The opportunity to play board games with their friends.

Please book your children for a full term (6 or 7 weeks depending on the day) Prices will be cheaper if you book your child in for a whole term, rather than one-off sessions. This is because the one-off bookings often lead to only one or two children attending the final 45 minutes. One-off sessions are still available at a cost of £6.00 for those who need it. We hope these changes will both enhance the provision at the club and encourage more children to join. Ian was also keen to confirm that Childcare vouchers are accepted, as well as tax free childcare.

We will be holding our first parents' evenings of the term on the first week back in Term 2. These will take place on the Wednesday and Thursday from 3:30pm on both evenings. Sign up sheets will be on display in the school office from Monday morning. There will also be Robins Preschool parents' meetings each day of that week from 3:00pm until 3:30pm. ### **News from the Classrooms**



This week in Robins we have been learning about farms and harvest. We have our own farm shop selling lovely real vegetables and have enjoyed making a farm mural using vegetables instead of paintbrushes!





This week the Kingfishers showed great progress reading and writing cvc words. In maths we learned to subitise to 3 and practised 1 more and 1 less through games. In science we learned how our body changes from childhood to old age and in Art we did observational drawings of a pumpkin and a branch of leaves with berries. We also had an amazing time in the harvest festival singing and performing our poem.





For European languages day in Starling class we looked at what countries make up Europe and how they say hello in their own language. We then looked more into German and learnt some German colour names and numbers.





In maths Goldfinches have been learning skills in addition and subtraction. The children love using manipulatives to help with their learning, especially when they are edible!
