We have spent the last couple of weeks consolidating all of our learning this term.

We have been taught 36 sounds this year and been assessed to see how many we can remember. If you would like to know which sounds your child could practise over the holidays please do get in touch. We are so proud of how far they have all come and will be moving on next term to even more digraphs and a couple of trigraphs!

In Maths, we have been thinking really hard about 2D shapes: square, rectangle, triangle and circle. We have been looking at their similarities and differences and trying to use some very mathematical terms to describe them - e.g. *curved edge, straight side, vertice*. The children are super keen to show off their knowledge. Over the holidays could they practise these words as they see shapes around them?

We have been thinking about Christmas and the Nativity story as well as learning about *Hannukah*. The class enjoyed lots of different arts and crafts and played games around these celebrations. We are adding characters to our Nativity scene and working out mathematical problems to open a new Christmas story each day. How are all your Santa advents looking? We can't wait to see his full beard - don't forget to send us some photos.

For the next two terms, we will be thinking about countries around the world and different habitats. We will invite 2

children each week to prepare a show-and-tell about the one that they have chosen. Look out on Seesaw for some more details and dates.

We hope you managed to get to our mini Nativity and enjoyed seeing and hearing the children shine as much as we did. They have been really excited about this performance and we are sure you have heard the songs a few times at home.

We have really enjoyed our sessions with Baskervilles this term and the children's confidence and competence with some of the skills they have been taught has been a delight to see increase. They have listened so well to multi-step instructions and been little stars.

In Science, we have been looking at melting and how things change over time. We will be building on this next term.

Where have the last few weeks gone?! Willow Class has worked incredibly hard over the last few weeks. They have all been fantastic this term!

In Maths, we have come to the end of our *addition and subtraction* topic. The children have consolidated their learning on column addition and subtraction and have applied this knowledge to number bonds to 100 and problem solving questions. Next term we'll be moving onto *multiplication and division*.

In English, the children have completed their independent writes based on the book: "The Flood". Last week, the children spent time self-assessing and peer-assessing their work. They should all be incredibly proud of themselves a they have all produced some remarkable pieces of writing!

Over the last three weeks in Geography, the children have started their new topic on *rivers*. We started our topic by investigating the River Nile. The children spent time studying pictures from Egyptian times to inform us how they lived. They then applied this knowledge to explore why the River Nile was so vital during Ancient Egypt. After the Christmas break, the children will consolidate their learning by recapping this lesson.

Finally, we have begun our Christmas celebrations in Willow Class! The children have created Christmas decorations to take home and have been listening to lots of Christmas music!
