## **Christmas at St Mary's**

This December at St Mary's, we celebrated Christmas with Christmas Jumper Day, Christingles, the Christmas Fayre, Nativities and Christmas parties.

Year 1 and year 2's Nativity was the Bethlehem Bake-Off. They performed it to all of the children in our school and their parents. They did things such as singing, baking and wonderful acting!

Reception and Nursery's Nativity was told through songs and narration. The school watched it on the 11th December and it was a great performance.

Christmas Jumper Day, which was the same day as the Christmas Fayre, was on the 8th of December. Everybody in our school came in wearing a Christmas jumper and donated some money to help give children the magical future they deserve. It is a fun way to help support some kids who are facing serious issues like war, hunger and poverty.

The Christmas Fayre had many stalls and all of them were very fun. It took place in Year 2, Year 1, the library and the hall. Year 5 and 6 ran the Christmas cookie decorating stall and it was one of the tastiest stalls. There was face painting, snowball fight, guess the name of the teddy, guess the number of sweets in a jar, and wreath making. The raffle was exciting and there were six crates stuffed with goods that you could possibly win. Teddy won the teddy! It was called Isaac. Elsie won the jar of sweets. There were one hundred and ninety sweets in there and she guessed one hundred and eighty-three.

The Christmas parties were held today on the 15th of December and the children did fun activities. They could bring in a change of clothes for the party in their class and if you wanted snacks you had to bring your own, because of dietary requirements. There would be fun Christmas games to play until the end of the party. You must have caught the Christmas spirit by then!

Did you know? The orange of a Christingle represents the world, the red ribbon or tape is the love and blood of Jesus, the sweets and dried fruit are all of God's creations, the cocktail sticks are the four seasons and the candle is Jesus' light in the world, bringing hope to people living in darkness. Christingles originated in Germany in 1747 in the village of John de Watteville. `Christingle` translates to `Christ Angel.` In our school, on December 18th, we had our Christingle service and we sung

Christmas carols and made Christingles.

What a great few weeks we've had. The children have worked so hard to share the Christmas Nativity with you. I'm sure you'll agree they were amazing. We were all so proud of them, learning their lines and remembering what to do at the right time. We've been thinking about different traditions we all have over the Christmas period.

We've continued embedding our number work within 10. We have been using 10s frames and are learning to count objects accurately into sets. We have enjoyed recognising shapes and finding different 2D shapes in our environment. We've created some great pictures using common 2D shapes.

Our writing continues to improve with daily phonics lessons. We have enjoyed focussing on "Can't you Sleep Little Bear" and using it as a stimulus for lots of conversations. We are working hard to strengthen our little hands, which also helps us write well. We enjoy our regular dough gym and threading activities.

As part of our Personal Social and Emotional Development, this term we've been learning about 'Me'. Why am I special? What am I good at? Learning that we have differences that need to be celebrated.

We are still having a big push on phonics in Year 2 and we have been focusing on alternate spellings for phonemes and alternate sounds for graphemes this term. This is a very tricky concept, however Badgers have risen to the challenge and I am so impressed with the progress they are making.

In Maths, we have been introducing the column method for addition and working out what to do when the ones total more than 9. The children couldn't be tricked and spotted all of the mistakes we made when modelling. Well done Badgers!

We have had a very crafty end to this term completing lots of our art projects. We have been focusing on creating abstract work linked to maps. The children have really enjoyed this and have made stained glass window maps and printed map work. They look really effective.

# Foxes Class

#### **Class News:**

What a wonderful few weeks to end Term 2.

In Fox Class, we have been busy learning more about the *Ancient Egyptians*. We have discovered more about the gods that they worshipped and the animals which represented their beliefs. We had great fun writing in hieroglyphics.

During Geography lessons, we have followed the course of a river from the source to the sea, learning lots along the way.

In English lessons, the children have written their version of the *Scarab's Secret*. I have been impressed with the children's ideas and their imagination. The children enjoyed reading their stories to each other and suggested ways to improve them. We have also been learning about letters. We have planned and written our own letter to Father Christmas, this included some challenging questions for him to answer.

In Maths, we have been learning about arrays in multiplication and division. We revisited the 2, 5 and 10 times tables and we have been working hard to master the three multiplication tables.

In Science, we planned and carried out an investigation.

The children measured their femurs and measured how far they could jump. They wanted to find out if people with the longest femurs could jump the furthest. We had some interesting results!

During Design Technology, we have been focussing on creating wonderful cushions using running stitch, cross stitch and applique.

Fox Class, alongside Lion Class, visited the Golden Oldies in Conygre Hall. They beautifully sang a selection of Christmas songs which enchanted the watching audience. They performed *Rudolf the Red-Nosed Reindeer* by singing it at the same time as using British Sign Language. This was tricky to master and I was astounded at how quickly the children were able to pick up this new skill. They also learned to sing *Feliz Navidad* (a Spanish Christmas song) and mastered all of the challenging Spanish words.

The end of term has brought with it many events. We enjoyed wearing our festive jumpers and getting into the Christmas spirit.

## Lions Class News:



This term has flown by and Lion Class have been working incredibly hard. In English, we have finished writing our own versions of *Varjak Paw*, ensuring they are full of suspense and intrigue. The children have really impressed me with their hard work on these and they have produced some wonderful stories that really do build up the tension!

In Geography, we have continued learning about Antarctica and have been thinking about the impact climate change is having on this vast continent. The children used their mathematical skills to interpret statistics that showed the decline in sea ice over the past few decades. The results were astonishing and the children were really keen to understand why global temperatures are rising and what can be done to tackle this important issue.

As Scientists, we are working on understanding *States of Matter* and have enjoyed getting hands on with a variety of different experiments that show changing states. We have

investigated how water goes through a variety of changes; such as a solid ice cube that melts becoming liquid, how steam becomes liquid through condensation and how gas appears as bubbles within liquid.

In Music, we finished the term with a wonderful performance of festive songs at the Timsbury Golden Oldies Christmas party. Alongside Year 3, the children sang a selection of songs which included them having to sing in Spanish and use sign language. The audience were fantastic and made us feel very welcome and the children represented the school beautifully.

Finally, we have found time to start getting in the Christmas spirit and have enjoyed taking part in all of the fantastic events that have been going on in school. **The Great Timsbury Bake Off** was a huge success and who knew we had so many fabulous bakers in Lion Class! We also enjoyed taking part in **Christmas Jumper Day**, raising money for **Save the Children**. We are looking forward to all the festive activities we have lined up for the last week of term.
