In Art, we are exploring clay and its properties. The children have designed their animal clay model and will create their masterpieces next week- we can't wait to see the results




Year 1

They learned how to use a question mark and exclamation mark in their writing, as well as applying superlatives to their work. In DT, they have been creating Colour Monster puppets, based on the story by Anna Llenas.

In Science, Year 1 have explored their senses; they have been investigating different methods to enhance each sense. The children have enjoyed learning about Bridget Riley in Art, and demonstrating their folding and curling techniques to create 3D sculptures using paper and card.

Books purchased are gifted in Celebration Assembly and a poster is added inside the book with your child's name and Birthday. All books are then placed in the library on our Birthday Book shelf. Attendance & Punctuality

We encourage all children to have excellent attendance at Norton Hill Primary: Regular school attendance brings enormous benefits to individual pupils, their families, schools and the community as a whole. Without regular attendance, levels of attainment suffer and opportunities are missed to obtain maximum benefit from education.

Persistent absence and lateness will affect a child's achievement and progress in school. Comprehensive research shows that there is a direct link between a child's level of school attendance and their level of school attainment.

As a parent it is your legal responsibility to ensure your child receives a suitable full time education. It is your responsibility that your child attends school each day and is on time.

It is important to set the expectation of good attendance right from the beginning of school so children grow up with 'good habits'

We realise that sometimes absence or lateness is unavoidable but this should be a rarity and not become the norm. If your child is absent from school you must inform the school, by telephone, giving a reason for the absence by 9am every morning of absence. Absences once reported are either authorised or unauthorised by the school.

Authorised absences would include time off for religious observance, medical appointments and genuine illness. Please note that the school has the right to ask for proof of medical appointments and confirmation from a medical professional.

Unauthorised absences would include time off for birthday treats, family days out, holidays

If you need to make a medical or dentist appointment:

Medical appointments should where possible be made outside school hours. When this is unavoidable, your child should be in school for the remainder of the school day, whether before or/and after the appointment. Proof of the appointment will be required.

Holidays & Leave of Absence

There is no legal entitlement to holidays or leave of absence during term time.

A leave of absence can now only be authorised in exceptional circumstances. Holidays are not deemed to be exceptional circumstances and therefore will not be authorised. If a parent wishes to request a Leave of Absence then a formal request must be made by completing a Absence Request Form. Please request these from the school office and any requests must be made in advance of the absence.

Lateness

Having good attendance also means being on time and not being late to school. Children who arrive late can feel embarrassed, left out and miss out on important introductions to lessons. Punctuality is an essential life skill that needs to be taught from the very beginning. The school day starts at 8.45am and all school pupils should be in class by this time. All children arriving via the School Office after this time will be marked as late.

What happens if we are worried about your child's school attendance?

Good attendance is 96% or more, if attendance is below 90% the child is classified as 'persistently absent' from school and this will have a negative impact on the child learning.

If we have concerns about your child's attendance, we will contact you so that we can offer support and work together to make sure your child's attendance is good. We employ an Education Welfare Officer (EWO) who will also work with families if there is concern about school attendance.

What you can do to help your child?

- Make sure your child comes to school regularly and punctually.
- Please support Norton Hill Primary in our efforts to encourage punctuality, good attendance and behaviour.
- Take an interest in your child's school work
- If your child if off school, it is very important you phone by 9am on the morning of absence to tell us why. Staff will be concerned if they do not hear from you.
- If your child has been away from school for more than 3 consecutive days you will be asked to provide confirmation you have consulted a GP/Pharmacist.
- If your child starts missing school, work with the school without delay to put things right. Communication is very important.
