The Advent season is a four week period before Christmas that celebrates the anticipation and coming of Jesus Christ. The origin of "advent" is from the Latin word adventus which simply translates "coming" or "arrival". It is a time when Christians prepare for the celebration of the coming of Jesus Christ. The four Sundays of Advent each have a specific theme or focus. The purpose of each theme is to spend time reflecting on the true meaning of the season - the life of Jesus Christ. The four themes are: hope, preparation, joy and love. Churches across the world light one candle per week to mark each week. For many families, Advent calendars carry the message of anticipation and hope in the run up to Christmas.


We had muddy welly walks where we looked for different shapes around us, counting them along the way. We explored words that rhyme and had a giggle coming up with words that didn't rhyme!

Class News:

Badger Class has been busy as always this fortnight. In Geography, we have been out in the school grounds looking at the features we can spot and then using positional language and compass directions to label an aerial photograph of the school. Ask the children if they can remember the points of the compass!

We had a trip to the War Memorial in Timsbury as part of our History topic on Remembrance. The children were really interested in the names of the soldiers inscribed on the memorial and made observational drawings of the poppy wreaths that had been placed there on Remembrance Day.

In Science, we conducted an experiment to understand why it is so important to wash our hands with soap rather than just with water. The "germs" were repelled by the soap and the Badgers really enjoyed this opportunity to work as real scientists.

Finally, in English, we finished writing the next chapter in the "Traction Man" story and then worked with a partner to edit and improve our stories. We have been so impressed with the amazing writing the Badgers produced, there were certainly some exciting adventures for "Traction Man"!


In Science lessons, we have been learning about the life cycle of insects, amphibians, flowering plants and trees. We have compared these life cycles and were surprised by how many similarities there were.


