

Thought of the Week

'As soon as Jesus was baptised, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased." (Matthew 3:16-17)



Today's verse happened just as Jesus was baptised in the River Jordan by John the Baptist. I wonder what it might have felt like to be there, hearing God's voice from heaven? What might the voice of God sound like?

How might it have felt for Jesus? To hear these words of affirmation from God the Father as he was about to embark on his mission to tell the world the good news? God the Father was letting everyone know that this was his Son and that he loved him and that he was really pleased with him. He was really pleased with him and he hadn't even done anything yet!

Often we want to hear someone telling us how pleased they are with us when we have actually done something and done it well. If you do a good job, then yes there is a reason for someone to be pleased with us. But have we ever told our children or maybe our other family members that we're pleased with them just because of who they are?

For some of us it can be difficult enough to tell them that we love them, let alone going so far as telling them how pleased we are with them. But when we think about our children and really consider them for a moment, we can begin to see just how fantastic it is to have them in our lives. In the business of life we forget just how special they are and what an amazing thing it is to have them with us. What a privilege it is to be involved in bringing these unique individuals into the world. For some of us it may be that we have only been involved in their upbringing, but still what a joy it can be when we realise how special and important this is.

So, this week, a challenge. Can you stop for a moment and think about that child or those children that you care for? Can you go a step further and consider the difference they make in your life and to those around them? Can you tell them that you love them? Can you tell them how pleased you are with them? Not because of their achievements or their school work or even for helping out around the house. Tell them how pleased you are with them because of who they are, that you are proud of them for being who they are.

It might only take a moment, but what a moment! After all, every single one of us is unique, created to be different, created to be in relationship with others and created to be loved. Every one of us needs to be told how great we are and how much we matter. I mean if Jesus needed to hear these words, how much more do we?
