### Anna Sabine MP visits Norton Hill Primary School to see safety concerns

I was delighted to come and meet with Headteacher Mrs Waterhouse last week to see first-hand what the issues are around safety for children crossing to and from school. I invited with me the B&NES' Highways representative to see the problem and with your Headteacher am calling for the council to urgently address the situation. Housing, whilst welcome, must be built in a way that helps not hinders the local area. More houses naturally bring with them, more traffic which if proper provisions aren't made, can make getting to and from school dangerous for children. I will be following up with the council and continuing to push for steps to be taken that can improve the safety for all pupils and their families trying to get to school.
