
PTA News

Class News:

Last week, we were looking at *Diwali* - a topic which sparked imagination and creativity. Conker Class really enjoyed retelling the story of the Hindu Festival of Light by acting it out, sequencing the story and trying some tasty cuisines. The children wrote invitations to one another for our Diwali celebration. We have also been identifying primary and secondary colours and painting a giant Rangoli.

This week, we have been focusing on the story: 'Stick Man'. We had a class discussion about what we can use sticks for: a fishing rod, a magic wand, a dog lead or even a boomerang! During the afternoon, we went to the woods and collected the best looking stick man. With our sticks we ordered them from the tallest to the shortest. Many of the children then went on to decorate their stick with a range of materials.

Conkers have also been reading and writing using their phase 2 sounds. I have been so pleased with how far they have come. In Maths, we have continued work on identifying 0-5, number patterns and combining two groups of objects.

Class News:

We are really getting stuck into our toys topic now! We have had fun exploring some old toys such as the 'zapper' from Quinn's family and we have enjoyed playing old playground games. As Historians, we have compared old toys to modern day toys and have linked this to our Science work where we are investigating materials. So far we have sorted toys into different groups and have been on a material hunt - we were surprised at how many objects are made up of more than one material.

As writers, Chestnut Class has been creating character descriptions: we started off linking our learning to the film: Toy Story 4 and describing our favourite character, then we wrote about our favourite characters from other films. Elsa, Spiderman and The Hulk were very popular! Now we are reading the story: 'Stanley's Stick' and we are putting our imaginations to good use. The children are currently planning wonderful stories based on having a stick as a toy. We have had unicorns, a 'stickasuarus', broomsticks and magic wands! I have been very entertained with the children's comical ideas and am looking forward to reading the stories they create. In Maths, we have focused on number bonds to 10 and we are now moving onto subtraction. The pesky puppets in our class keep taking things away and it's our job to find how many are left.

Class News:

Over the past two weeks, we have been exploring one of my favourite story books from when I was a child: 'The Jolly Postman'. We have looked at all the different styles of letter writing - from informal postcards to more formal writing - and we have looked at all the different features of a letter. Using this knowledge, we have begun composing our very own letters, but we have been writing as if we are WW1 soldiers writing from the trenches. We began by building our very own trench in the classroom and we soon realised we could barely last 4 minutes let alone 4 days, which is often how long the soldiers had to spend in a frontline trench.

During our afternoon sessions, we are continuing to explore our *Remembrance* topic through our Music, Art and History lessons. In Music this week, Mr Purnell delighted us with a soundscape. We carefully chose and used our instruments to suit the atmosphere we were trying to create. Using small percussion instruments, we created the sound of animals within the trenches and we explored tempo to create the feeling of going to war.

In PE sessions we are improving our gymnastics skills and learning how to use equipment safely. We were very lucky to have a visitor this week who showed us how to skip correctly. A particularly big well done to Freya-Mae who skipped for the first time!

Above all, I am most impressed with how the children have improved their stamina this term! We fit in so much learning in the school day and I am delighted with how much they are achieving. Keep it up, Cedar Class!



Reporting absences

A reminder that if your child is going to be off school for any reason, you need to advise the School Office - please do not use SeeSaw for this purpose. We will need to see confirmation of any medical or dental appointments. If your child has been absent for more than 3 consecutive days or their attendance is low, you may be asked to provide confirmation/evidence that you have consulted a GP/pharmacist. If your child is poorly, please phone the School Office as early as you can on the first morning - you can press 1 to leave a voicemail. For all illness-related absences you will need to call the office **every day** they are not in school. We are currently keeping separate records of any children who are absent for Covid-19 related reasons - whether they or a family member have developed a symptom. Please keep us informed of any test results.

Help paying for childcare
