We can hardly believe that we are now at the end of Term 2!

We are so super proud of Conkers and everything they have learned since starting school. Their attitude towards learning is amazing and they are always keen to please - what a fantastic class!

We really enjoyed our Christmas celebration on Wednesday afternoon. We had learned some songs to share and then had lots of time to be creative with our families. Thank you to everyone that came for making it such a busy fun afternoon.

We have completed a whole stage in Phonics and the children are looking forward to moving on next term to some trickier digraphs (2 letters that make one sound). Please do practise their reading books over the holidays to keep these phonics fresh in their minds.

In Maths, we have been looking at ways to break and make 5, eg 4 + 1, 3 + 2. We have played games with a partner where one hid some fingers and the other had to work out the other part. We are becoming Masters of Maths by recording these number sentences on a bar model.

The snow took us by surprise this week but we embraced the opportunity to explore outside and be snow angels. Each day in December, we have been opening up our class advent that contains characters from the Nativity story. We have been retelling the story using a variety of resources.

Chestnut Class

Class News:

What a wonderful final two weeks of term we have had in Chestnut Class! The children have been learning lots of new songs for our Nativity: *"The Bethlehem Bake-Off"*, along with actions to bring it to life. Some children chose to have a speaking part and had many lines to learn, but they rose to the challenge and made us feel really proud of their performances. It is amazing to think that during the last couple of years, the pandemic has meant that our Christmas performances have not quite been the same - but this year the children really did put on a show!

We have continued to learn our latest phonemes in our Phonics lessons. The children have had the incredibly challenging task of learning that in the English language, there are many alternative ways of writing the /ee/ sound, for example /ea/, /e/ and sometimes even /ie/ like in the word thief. They have also been learning to identify the /aw/ phoneme this week and have applied this new learning in their sentences. I am so impressed with the way the children are becoming increasingly independent in their writing.

In Maths, we wrapped up our work on addition and subtraction last week and began to learn about 2D and 3D shapes this week. Ask your child if they can recognise any household items which are cylinders, cubes, cuboids or spheres.

In PSHE this term, we have been celebrating our differences. The children have made wonderful gingerbread men as part of this activity and thought about how they are unique individuals.

Term 2 has been fantastic! Willow Class has worked incredibly hard over the last 7 weeks and I have been amazed with their motivation in lessons and their enthusiasm for learning.

Over the last two weeks, we have come to the end of our addition and subtraction topic. The children have worked very hard and showed amazing abstract examples of column *addition* and *subtraction*. This week we have focused on *estimating calculations* and *inverse operations*. Our next topic after Christmas will be *multiplication* and *division*.

In English, we have finished *"The Secret of Black Rock"*. I am incredibly proud of the quality of the sentences they have all come up with, well done Willow Class! This week, we have been playing around with sentences to understand how we can extend and add detail to our writing. The children have already come up with some brilliant examples!

In Geography, we have come to the end of our *Rivers* and *Mountains* topic. We spent our last lesson focusing on why rivers are important to people. We concentrated on two river examples: the Volga River and the Amazon River. The children enjoyed learning about these two examples and were able to write detailed sentences why these rivers are famous and why they are important to people.

Where has the term gone? As ever, Cherry Class has had a busy couple of weeks.

In Maths, we have been working hard on multiplication and division. We have focused on the 6, 7, 9, 11 and 12 times tables. The children have been fantastic at pattern spotting and using what they know to work out what they don't!

Playing around with sentences has been great fun over the last couple of weeks as we explored sentence structure and word choices for effect. The children have also completed an exciting independent write based on *"The Snowman"* by Raymond Briggs.

Sound has continued to be our focus in Science. Last week, we had fun experiencing light travelling faster than sound. The

school hill provided a great vantage point to demonstrate this. We also consolidated our understanding of how sound is made and changed.

In Computing, we have been learning how to record and edit sound. Last week, we made our first podcast as a class all about the Romans. Stay tuned for our next episode!
