We need to clarify the Government guidelines on holidays in term time. Please see the extracts from the Department for Education below:

Where parents decide to have their child registered at school, they have an additional legal duty to ensure their child attends that school regularly. This means their child must attend every day that the school is open, except in a small number of allowable circumstances such as being too ill to attend or being given permission for an absence in advance from the school.

As head teachers should only grant leaves of absence in exceptional circumstances it is unlikely a leave of absence will be granted for the purposes of a family holiday.

These rules apply to all children at school regardless of age, although obviously not to the children in our preschool. Therefore moving forward, please do not expect any holiday request to be granted unless there are very exceptional circumstances.
