Reminder to Vote in the Parent Governor Elections
Monday 1st June to Friday 12th June

Thank you for your continued engagement with Norton Hill Primary School. I am writing to invite you to participate in an exciting opportunity that brings together school governance and an important lesson in democratic values.

We are delighted to be expanding our parent representation on our governing body and are now moving into the election stage. Please find below our candidate statements, and we very much hope you will consider casting your vote.

This election comes at a particularly significant moment. The Children's Commissioner, Dame Rachel de Souza, is championing important changes around children's rights and democratic participation. For the first time, hundreds of thousands of children will be eligible to vote in the next general election at the age of 16. She is encouraging schools to explore how children can become more involved in and supportive of local politics and change.

We felt this was the perfect opportunity for our Pupil Parliament to lead the parent governor election here at Norton Hill Primary. By doing so, we can model the values we teach our children every day: the importance of having a voice, feeling included in decision-making, and understanding the power of democratic participation. Our children already experience voting throughout the year – most recently, they voted on our new school song, and this is a wonderful chance for you to demonstrate these principles alongside them.

As of Monday 1st June, the Picasso Room will be open as a polling station. Our polling station will be open daily Monday to Friday between 3.10 and 3.30 pm. All votes will be placed securely in a voting box. Voting will continue over the next ten school days and will officially close on Friday 12th June at 3.30 pm.

As in line with all voting, please get in touch via the school office if you would like to be a proxy vote; although it would be great to see as many of you as possible face to face.

We very much hope you will make the time to vote and, in doing so, model the importance of democratic participation to our children.
