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## Thought of the Week

"You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbour and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5: 43-45)



'Remember, remember the 5th of November, Gunpowder, treason and plot. I see no reason why gunpowder season Should ever be forgot.'

Most of us will be celebrating with bonfires, fireworks and sparklers this weekend. It's a great opportunity to get together with friends and family and as the nights are closing in, what better reason for making a fire and letting off a few fireworks.

Many of us know that the roots of this festival go back to the early 17th century when James 1 was king. In 1534, Henry VIII made himself head of the Church of England and broke from the Catholic Church so that he could divorce his first wife Catherine of Aragon. He had been a devout Catholic for most of his life, but because he wanted to end his marriage and was becoming romantically interested with Anne Boleyn, he used parliament to grant the Act of Supremacy. This meant he was allowed to annul his marriage to Catherine and it made him the head of the English Church. It also meant he would have more power so he could strip all the monasteries of their treasures and sell their land for a profit, but that's the kind of king he was.

This now meant that everyone in the country was being forced to convert to Protestantism and if they didn't, they could be imprisoned, tortured or even executed for sticking to their denominational beliefs. This was still the case in 1605 when James I was king, which is why Robert Catesby along with some other Catholics plotted to assassinate the king and blow up the House of Lords.

We know that the plot failed and that the plotters were executed, but attitudes towards Catholics worsened and there are still issues between Protestants and Catholics to this day.

I wonder how Jesus would see this?

For those who are very observant, you might notice that the verses for today were used previously on September 29th. This is because Jesus wanted his followers to love their enemies. This should of course include those who worship and practise their faith differently, but who basically believe the same thing. Both Catholics and Protestants believe in the Apostles Creed -

It's a shame that throughout history, things have often been difficult between people who profess to follow Jesus and his teachings. Jesus said don't respond with violence, respond with love, even to the point of praying for those who persecute you!

This Guy Fawkes Day, we can remember and

celebrate that the plot to assassinate the king did fail and that lives were saved. Can we go even further and remember the destructive power of hatred and the redeeming power of love?
