# Important - Track and Trace over Christmas holidays

For the first 6 days of the Christmas holidays, if your child tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, we need to identify close contacts and advise on self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school. It is extremely important therefore that if you have a positive Covid-19 test result between Saturday 19th – Thursday 24th December 2020, you follow these reporting steps:

- 1. Send an email to mnsp-covid19-alert@ msnpartnership.com titled - "Positive Result -Student or Staff".
- 2. On receipt of the automated response, follow the link to complete the Google form and submit.
- 3. A response will be received by MNSP Senior Staff and the relevant School Headteacher notified.
- 4. Telephone contact will be made to confirm/clarify details.

#### **Class News:**

Last week, Conkers had a super week. We started to look at the Christmas story, listening to stories and wearing costumes to act it out. Conkers have been investigating the concept of melting by using hot objects such as a hair dryer, microwave and a little bit of sunshine to melt our marshmallow snowman. We decided that the microwave melted the marshmallows the quickest and, due to the sun being behind the clouds, this was the slowest way to melt the snowman.

Despite Outdoor Learning being rather wet, the children still enjoyed making puppets using a variety of different materials. They then used their puppets to act out narratives.

In Maths, we have continued to look at *subitising* (visually recognising patterns) in numbers 0-7. The children are noticing patterns and beginning to find the links between numbers such as:

#### 2+3=5 4+1=5 5+0=5

This week, the children have written their Christmas lists to Santa, focusing on their letter formation and hearing-sounds in words. We have continued to retell the Christmas story and explored why we celebrate Christmas. Conkers have also begun to understand the concept of freezing, building on from last week's experiments with melting.

## **Chestnut Class**



#### **Class News:**

We took this responsibility very seriously - we started by reading and watching different versions of the story, comparing and contrasting similarities and differences. Then, to deepen our knowledge, we got dressed up and acted out the story. We sent our spectacular performance to the North Pole and they responded by gifting the class some amazing toys including a marble run and threading kits. The next step in the challenge was to write the Christmas story. We have spent this week making sure it is perfect, as we really want to help the elf.

On Wednesday we came into the classroom to find the elf stuck! We put our problem-solving hats on and worked in teams to design a cunning plan to help him, without touching him. The children's creativity was outstanding, but what shone through was their compassionate side. They were mainly concerned about the elf's safety and everyone suggested ways to protect the elf from getting a head bump.

In addition to our elf tasks, we've been finding the missing

part in Maths by adding on, solving word problems and using number lines to answer questions. As Scientists, we've sorted toys by their materials and experimented with different ways to manipulate materials. We tried really hard to bend the table and twist the playdough without breaking it! We were also lucky enough to explore some very precious old toys which supported our learning in History. Edie brought in a great metal fire truck and Quinn presented us with an old toy that gave us a zap! The children were very intrigued by this and showed lots of courage as they gave it a go.

#### Reporting absences

A reminder that if your child is going to be off school for any reason, you need to advise the School Office - please do not use SeeSaw for this purpose. We will need to see confirmation of any medical or dental appointments. If your child has been absent for more than 3 consecutive days or their attendance is low, you may be asked to provide confirmation/evidence that you have consulted a GP/pharmacist. If your child is poorly, please phone the School Office as early as you can on the first morning - you can press 1 to leave a voicemail. For all illness-related absences you will need to call the office **every day** they are not in school. We are currently keeping separate records of any children who are absent for Covid-19 related reasons - whether they or a family member have developed a symptom. Please keep us informed of any test results.
