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News from the Classrooms



We have been talking all about fireworks and bonfires in Robin Class this week. The children have created different firework art; using paint, glue and different shapes. We have watched firework display videos and spoken about how to stay safe when watching fireworks. We have also been exploring light and dark as our theme of this term.





Recently we had an intruder in our classroom!!! Professor Klunk borrowed all our drawings and magical writing to feed his Big Dream Story Machine. In Goldfinch class we started our new science topic of electricity. This week we were looking at electrical appliances and how to be safe when using electricity. We created posters to show how to be safe around electricity and what might happen if we are not responsible.





In Swallows this week, we started our Geography topic on Global Trade. We looked at importing and exporting goods. The children then created a world trade flow chart to show where our imported items come from. They used maps to find the countries and then draw arrows from that country to the UK.
