Science Week

We will be celebrating British Science Week from Monday 11th March - Friday 15th March. The theme this year is 'Time'.

At the end of Science Week, we will be presenting prizes for winning projects, and certificates for all who participate.



STEM Fair Ideas

Time is key to so many discoveries in science, technology, engineering and maths. Evolution looks at how plants and animals changed over a long period of time; the Earth's movements show us why we have seasons and different time zones.

Lifecycles are all about how organisms grow and die during their time on our planet. You could investigate the lifespan of other animals, and how they spend their time.

Time is also vital in engineering; complicated machines have moving parts that all need work in time with each other for the machine to work smoothly.

Or, perhaps you could consider the issue food waste by thinking about how passing time impacts different foods!

Year 3

We've been working our Gecko tails off in Year 3 this term!

In English, we've been creating realistic dialogue using inverted commas and adventurous verbs. We also pretended to be volcanoes in order to write powerful volcano poetry. In computing, we've been learning about data and how to store it effectively using spreadsheets - a simple game of Top Trumps helped us with this one. In History, we've explored the Romans and their invasion of Britain - our knowledge on this topic is particularly impressive. Furthermore, in addition to our ordinary RE lessons, we've also had two visitors: one for a Judaism workshop and one for a Humanism workshop.

As if this wasn't enough, we have also been fortunate enough to have our wonderful adults join us for a morning of Starbooks AND an afternoon of party (budget) planning. And celebrated World Book Day too! It's been wonderfully exhausting for us all.

One particular highlight was how quickly we adapted to cross-stitch in D.T. A few of us even persuaded our adults to help us continue this outside of school. Another fantastic highlight is how well we continue to adapt to French vocabulary, especially as we are now learning classroom instructions which can be used by the teacher at any moment...

For World Book Day, we competed to identify the masked reader which was tremendously tricky. We also read the book 'Leaf' and explored the concept of being different or new to an environment through role-play and hot-seating. Our day was broken up by visits from Mrs Waterhouse and Mrs Welch who read us some entertaining stories! And we obviously had to begin a class read-through of Fantastic Mr Fox to finish it all off.
