School Values: Respect






One of our school values is RESPECT.

Polite reminder:



Yellow zig-zag lines outside of our school indicate the length of road where stopping or waiting is strictly prohibited. This is because it poses a danger to children and families crossing the road to come to school—they cannot safely see to cross.

We know that the village roads get busy, and that some parents do need to drive pupils to school. We, unfortunately, have seen an increase in parents stopping on yellow lines. This has been reported to us and to our local community police.

As a school, we do not accept any deliveries at drop off or collection time, and in school hours will contact delivery firms if lorries are seen on these yellow lines. We have also logged a request with BANES to come and repaint the lines. Please help us to keep your children safe by not parking, even for a short space of time, on these lines. Many thanks.
