We are VERY excited to have all the children back together in school on Monday ... feedback indicates that parents/ carers are very happy too!!!!

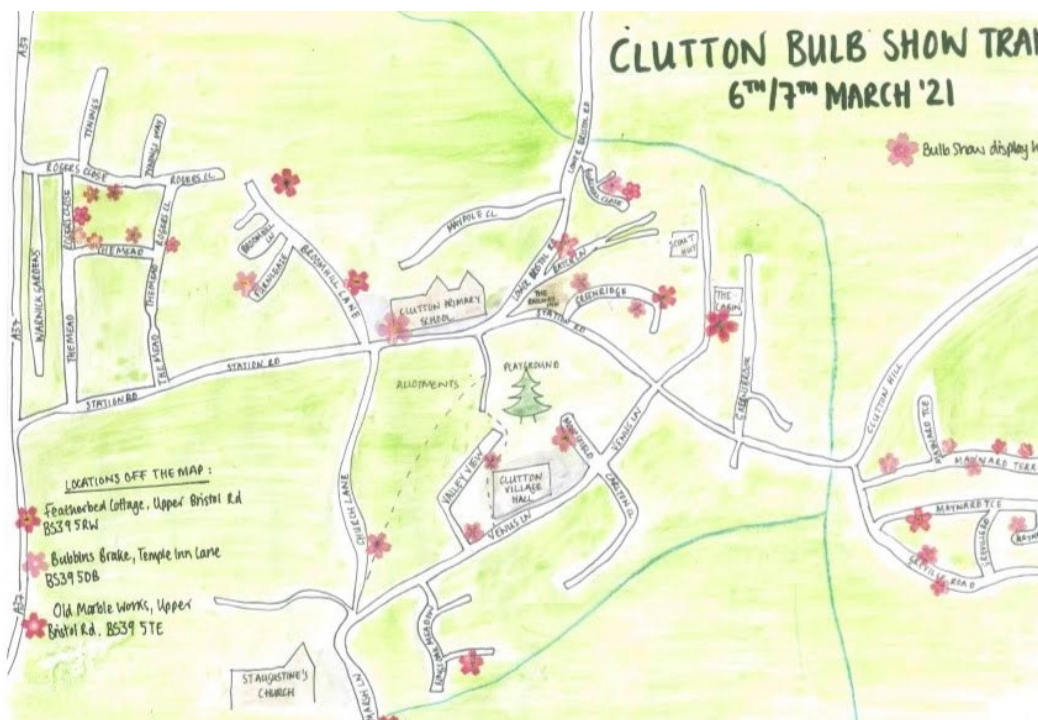

Time to talk:

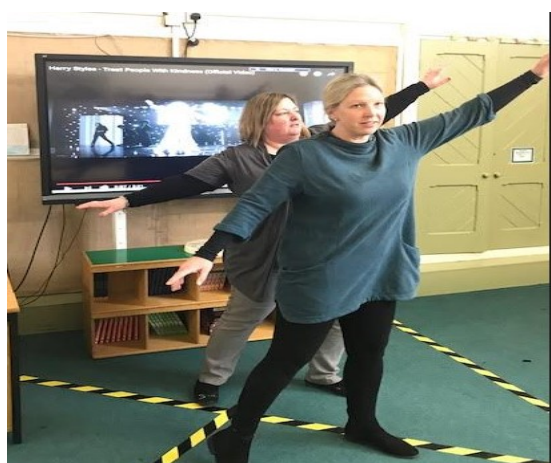
