Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a pleasure to meet many of you at the beginning and end of school each day. I have really enjoyed my first week at Hemington and would like to thank children, families and staff for such a warm welcome.

It has been a very busy week as I learn to know the school and how it is structured. I thought it would be timely to provide an update for families.

### Open Day Wednesday 12th October, 09.30-10.30am

We will be welcoming families whose children are looking to start school in September 2023 to come and look around Hemington on the morning of Wednesday 12th October. This will coincide with our regular Forest School Stay and Play session, which runs from 9.30am every Wednesday. Please spread the word to friends and family who you think might be interested.

#### Communication

This is one of my first priorities. It can be very challenging to ensure consistent communication in schools when key staff are absent. We are putting together an online calendar which will be added to our website very soon with all the key dates for the year to help give you an overview of what is coming up.

In the first week after half term, we will be holding Parents' Evenings so that you can discuss your child's progress with your child's class teacher. These will continue to be online as feedback shows this helps what can be a very busy event run smoothly. However, we also recognise that parents and carers value opportunities to see their children in action and view their child's work. Throughout the year we will be maximizing opportunities for parents and carers to come into school. The parents' evenings will be on **Tuesday 1st November and Wednesday 2nd November between 3.30pm and 5.30pm**.

Sometimes, a 10 minute parents' evening consultation is insufficient time to discuss a child's progress/needs. Now that covid restrictions are in the past we are keen to embrace an open door policy and encourage parents to feel free to ask for an appointment to meet your child's teacher at any time during the year.

#### Nightingale class

I have been very impressed by the resilience the children in Nightingale class have shown this week. It is not always easy when your regular teacher is replaced by a number of different supply teachers. This week, Mrs Remington has been teaching the class Wednesday - Friday. Next week, I have taken the precaution of booking Mrs Remington in for the entire week so that she and Mrs Hayward can plan together and provide consistency and stability for the children.
