Concerns about uniform and PE kit not being consistent	 We sent out an updated uniform policy at the end of term 5 to ensure new shoes or uniform bought before the summer holidays are appropriate. We will be monitoring school uniform/PE kit from September onwards. 			
Concerns about behaviour	 We have purchased new Golden Rules' signage for all classrooms to make expectations clear. We have undertaken an extensive review of our values - these will be embedded in all we do in school. We have updated our behaviour policy to make it much tighter and simpler to follow and be understood by children, parents and staff. We have set time aside at our INSET Days to ensure there is clarity around the behaviour policy with staff to ensure consistency. This will be shared with parents early in Term 1. Parents will be informed at an earlier stage to limit low-level behaviours. 			
Understanding children's progress	 Open door Wednesday was infrequently taken up by parents. We will move this to alternate Fridays straight after school when there is a Celebration Assembly and more parents are on site. After children have completed their autumn and spring assessments, we will share these results with parents via a 'report card', this will be in addition to our autumn and spring Parents' Evenings and our open offer to discuss children's end of year reports.
