Caving and hiking for years 3,4 & 5	£2,615	To offer children access to physical activity beyond usual team / individual sports.	Children developed an understanding of a lesser-known sport/activity. Children were able to conquer their fears of dark and confined spaces. Children problem solved in small groups.
Wheelchair Basketball	£250	For children to experience how competitive disability sport is.	Children were able to recognize the commitment and skill of sportsmen and women with disabilities, as well as learning that able-bodied sportsmen and women can compete in wheelchair basketball as equals.
Employment of Specialised Sports coach	£4,710	For children to access a well-planned and well-delivered sports curriculum.	Children enjoyed specialised coaching offered by PPA cover teacher/instructors. Talent was identified and reported back to PE leader. Signposting was in place for identified talent, e.g. Bath University intervention.
Skipping Day	£350	For all children to engage in an individual, non-competitive physical activity.	Children enjoyed the input from the specialist coach. They were able to purchase equipment to continue skipping at home.
Rounders / Cricket Hockey sets & additional equipment	£937	To offer all children a chance to engage in physical activity in new after school clubs.	Children were able to access and enjoy using this new equipment.
