Dear Parents and Carers,

The government has introduced new relationships and sex education and health (RSHE) education guidance that all schools are required to follow from **1 September 2026**. As a result of this, we have updated our RSHE policy to ensure we meet the government's requirements, as well as the needs of all our pupils.

We have worked hard to make sure that our policy reflects:

- Our pupils' ages and developmental stages, as well as their physical and emotional maturity and cultural and religious backgrounds
- Every pupil's learning needs, including the needs of any pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)
- MNSP's vision and values
- What pupils need to know to be healthy and safe in school, in their personal relationships and in the wider world

In addition to this Trust level policy, schools will provide curriculum overviews, which detail how they will implement the policy. These will be available on school websites from September 2026

We are now consulting with Parents and Carers on the revised policy and welcome your feedback.
