



#### The Holocaust


On Thursday 27th January, we celebrated the 77 year anniversary of the liberation of the concentration camp, Auschwitz, with Holocaust Memorial Day. Millions of people (mostly Jews) died during the Holocaust. During Holocaust Meorial Day we learnt that Adolf Hitler ordered the Nazi soldiers to build concentration camps for thousands of Jews and other persecuted races. This was not a holiday camp. #### WALT: write a balanced argument.







#### Why was Valentines Day invented?

As you know, Valentine's Day is to celebrate romance and love. But that isn't how Valentines was invented. Kind of the opposite.

Though no one has pinpointed the exact origin of the holiday, one good place to start is ancient Rome, where men hit on women, by actually hitting them.

#### **Crazy Romans**

From February 13 to 15, the Romans celebrated the feast of Lupercalia. The men sacrificed a goat and a dog, then whipped women with the hides of the animals they had just slain.

The Roman romantics" says Noel Lenski, a historian at the University of Colorado at Boulder. Young women would actually line up for the men to hit them, Lenski says. They believed this would make them fertile.

The brutal fete included a matchmaking lottery, in which young men drew the names of women from a jar. The couple would then be, um, coupled up for the duration of the festival — or longer, if the match was right.

The ancient Romans may also be responsible for the name of our modern day of love. Emperor Claudius II executed two men — both named Valentine — on Feb. 14 of different years in the 3rd century A.D. Their martyrdom was honored by the Catholic Church with the celebration of St. Valentine's Day.

















#### ♥How to make your Valentines Heart♥

2♥fold the top left corner to bottom corner and unfold so it's like the picture.






3♥turn the paper around like a diamond and then fold the top corner to the middle like shown in the picture.

#### Online safety: top tips





#### Chat to them about what they like to do online

The best way to find out what your child is doing online is to talk to them and have regular conversations so that online safety is part of everyday discussion. Ask them open-ended questions like 'What's your favourite game or app to play on?'.

- Listen to what they have to say and show an interest.
   They could give you a demo of their favourite app or show you their favourite YouTube or TikTok account.
- They will probably be able to teach you things you don't know! This will also give you an opportunity to chat about any safety settings they might already have in place.
- Regular conversations with your child will encourage them to come to you if they ever need support or advice.

#### Talk about who they are in contact with online

There are lots of different ways that children can talk to people online – messaging apps, on social media, and less obvious ways such as chat on online games. Talk to your child about who they are talking to and what they are sharing with them.

- Use settings to help limit who can contact your child.
- Remind your child that they shouldn't share personal information with people they don't know online.
- Let your child know they can come to you or another trusted adult if any conversation makes them feel uncomfortable.

Make sure to talk to your child first before implementing any new settings and explain to them how they help to keep them safe.

#### Help manage what they see and do online

Parental controls and privacy settings can help you manage how your child spends time online and help to keep them safe.

- Device settings manage things like location sharing, screen time and in-app purchases. Most tech
  and gaming companies have dedicated pages to support with setting these up.
- App or game settings in-app tools that can help to keep your child's account private and manage who they're
  talking to. You can normally find information on these in account settings or directly on the platforms website.
- Mobile or network provider settings help to manage browsing access and stop your child from visiting
  inappropriate sites or downloading apps that aren't suitable. Contact your mobile or broadband provider
  for more information about setting this up.

#### Remember it's ok to ask for help!

Remember you don't have to be an online safety expert – that's our job! We're here to help, with resources and advice to help support you and your child.

If your child asks you a question you don't know the answer to, or speaks to you about a negative experience they had online, here are some of things you could do:

- Visit the NSPCC online safety hub: nspcc.org.uk/onlinesafety
- Call the NSPCC helpline 0808 800 5000 to speak to an advisor
- Ask another parent
- Speak to your child's teacher
- If your child needs more support, they can contact Childline: childline.org.uk






#### **Online Safety**

#### Safer Internet Day

Midsomer Norton Primary School held a Safer Internet Day on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> February 2022 where we learnt all about how to keep ourselves safe and protected whist online. Test your knowledge in this great Online Safety Quiz from the NSPCC – the answers are at the end.

#### Online safety quiz



- You've received a friend request from someone you don't know. do you accept them?
- A) No, you decline the request and block them. If it's made you feel uncomfortable or worried you tell a parent / guardian / teacher.
- B) Yes, and then send them a message asking who they are.
- C) You ask your friends to find out if anyone knows who the person is and only accept if someone else knows them.
- 3. Your friend always 'checks in' to whatever location you are at, tagging you in the post too. Should you ask her to stop tagging you?
- A) Yes, talk to your friend to ask them not to check in because you don't want to share details of your location. Talk about why it isn't always a good idea to share your location online when you aren't sure who will be able to see it.
- B) No, just have a competition to see who can tag who quickest next time!
- C) You'd like to, but you know they will say you are being silly by not wanting them to tag you.
- 5. In a game chat someone you don't know sends you a link. What do you do?
- A) Don't click on any links. You can report the message or just delete straight away.

#### Valentine's Biscuit Recipe

#### by Maisie Dezis

Here's what to do - you should get 21 Valentine's Day cookies.

#### Ingredients

- 110 g (3.9 oz) margarine;
- 100 g (3.5 oz) white caster sugar (superfine);
- 1 medium free range eggs;
- 1/2 tsp vanilla extract;
- 250 g (8.8 oz) plain white flour (all purpose flour) plus extra for dusting;
- 1/4 tsp bicarbonate of soda (baking soda);
- 1/4 tsp baking powder;
- 1/4 tsp salt;
- 1 tbsp icing sugar (powdered sugar);
- 1 tsp cornflour (cornstarch) for dusting;
- 100 g (3.5 oz) pink sugar paste vegetarian if required;
- 100 g (3.5 oz) red sugar paste vegetarian if required;
- 100 g (3.5 oz) white sugar paste vegetarian if required;
- 30 g (1.1 oz) heart-shaped sprinkles.

#### Instructions

- Preheat the oven to 200C (180C fan-assisted, 400F);
- Put the margarine, sugar, eggs and vanilla in a large mixing bowl;
- · Beat until light and fluffy:
- Add the flour, baking powder, salt and bicarbonate of soda;
- Turn out the dough onto a very well-floured board and knead only as much as it takes to get a smooth ball of dough. Chill for about 15 minutes until firm enough to roll out;
- Roll out to approximately 7-8mm thick (approx 1/3 inch);
- Cut out the heart shapes. Gather the offcuts back up and re-roll. You should get 21 heart biscuits in all;
- Place the cookies on a baking sheet lined with baking paper;
- Bake the cookies for 8 minutes or until pale golden at the edges.
   Cool on a wire rack;
- On a clean board, dusted with cornflour, roll out the icing, one colour at a time and cut out heart shapes;
- Arrange the cooled cookies on a clean surface;
- In a small container, mix the icing sugar with a tbsp of water until dissolved to make a watery 'glue';
- Brush a heart biscuit with the 'glue';



Gently place a sugar paste heart on the cookie;

Grab a handful of the sprinkle hearts and dot the glue where you
want one to go before pushing it gently into the icing. Use 8-10 per
biscuit;

Repeat until all your cookies are decorated. Leave them to dry, then enjoy!

1.with 70 percent of the Earth's surface taken up by ocean, it's evident how vital these marine environments are to the planet and how much there still is to be explored.



- 2. As so much of the Earth's surface is underwater, it comes as no surprise that marine species outnumber those on land. But, it's an incredible 94 per cent of the Earth's living species that exist within the oceans.
- 3.Earth's longest chain of mountains, the Mid-Ocean Ridge, is almost entirely beneath the ocean, stretching across a distance of 65,000 kilometers. It's said that this mountain chain is less explored than the surface of Venus or Mars.
- 4.Around 1,000 shipwrecks lie off the Florida Keys alone, some of which are within the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary. Other underwater museums have been created in recent years, including the Mediterranean's submerged bronze statue, Christ of the Abyss.
- 5. The name "Pacific Ocean" comes from the latin name Tepre Pacificum, "peaceful sea.
- 6.According to the World Register of Marine Species there are now 240,470 accepted species, but this is believed to be just a small proportion of the species that exist, with new marine life being discovered everyday.
- 7. When salt water and hydrogen sulfide combine, it becomes denser than the rest of the water around it, enabling it to form a lake or river that flows beneath the sea.
- 8. The oceans provide 99% of the living space on the planet containing 50-80% of all life
- 9. With 25,000 islands lying within it, the Pacific Ocean has more islands than anywhere else on the planet.
- 10.Sea lions are strong swimmers and can reach speeds of nearly 20 miles per hour in the water.
- 11. They swim using their long foreflippers to generate power and their hind flippers to steer.




