

Term 5


Amethyst power for keeping focus (listening to advice and instructions, managing distractions and keeping concentration and having a sense of pride in everything you do).


Term 6


How to look after a cat

The Great Spotted Woodpecker



The Great Spotted Woodpecker was known to live in Scotland and Northern England in the first half of the 19th century. The Great Spotted Woodpecker has made a comeback during the past 100 years. Today it's the most common species of British Woodpecker, breeding in almost every mainland County.

All About Valentine's Day

Valentine's Day, also called St Valentine's or the feast of Valentine, is celebrated on 14 February. It is celebrated every year. It is the day that some people give cards to their loved ones (or even chocolates, flowers or sometimes a cake)!

As the idea of love began to take the shape during that period, so did the symbolism. Chocolate boxes, balloons, candles and much more heart-shaped items you or someone else would give.

The History

On February 14th, around the year 270 A.D., Valentine, a holy priest in Rome in the days of Emperor Claudius II, is said to have been executed.

under the rule of Claudius the Cruel, Rome was involved in many unpopular and bloody campaigns. The emperor had to maintain a strong army, but was having a difficult time getting soldiers to join his military leagues. Claudius believed that Roman men were unwilling to join the army because of their strong attachment to their wives and families. To get rid of the problem, Claudius banned all marriages and engagements in Rome. Valentine, realizing the injustice of the decree, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret.

When Valentine's actions were discovered, Claudius ordered that he be put to death. Valentine was arrested and dragged before the Prefect of Rome, who sentenced him to be beaten to death with clubs and to have his head cut off. Savage! This sentence was carried out on February 14th, on or about the year 270.

Legend also has it that, while in jail, St. Valentine left a farewell note for the jailer's daughter, who had become his friend, and signed it "From Your Valentine."




For his great service, Valentine was named a saint after his death. In truth, the exact origins and identity of St. Valentine are unclear.



According to the Catholic Encyclopaedia, "At least three different Saint Valentines, all of them martyrs, are mentioned in the early martyrologies under the date of 14 February." One was a priest in Rome, the second one was a bishop of Interamna (now Terni in Italy) and the third, Saint Valentine was a martyr in the Roman province of Africa.




