#### **Careers Week**

Wrens, Bramblings and Nuthatches enjoyed a visit from Little City. The students enjoyed exploring a variety of different job roles including hairdresser, mechanic, café owner and supermarket to name a few. It was really great to see the students interacting with the different roleplay areas and learning about the different job roles.

Mark Carter from the NHS visited Nuthatches, Finches and Starlings. In these interactive sessions he spoke about visiting a hospital and also the different jobs available.

We held a careers cafe for those students in Kestrels, Hawks and Post 16. This gave them an opportunity to meet a variety of people and understand more about their possible next steps. Thanks to Somerset Skills and Learning, Nathan an ex-student, Paul from Just a Chance charity, Asia, who works for Frome Town Council as a Town Ranger, Emma France our independent careers and skills advisor, Ms Rose and the Post 16 students for creating some informative short films about life in Post 16.

As part of Global recycling day Suez recycling also visited with their Romaquip and spoke to students about job opportunities and recycling in the county.

Those students currently on our supported internship programme visited Asda in Frome, Thanks to Jackie for talking to them about working at Asda.

### **Supported Internship**

A supported internship is a structured work-based study programme for students with SEND. The core aim of a supported internship study programme is a substantial work placement, facilitated by the support of an expert job coach.

The internship is designed for individuals with SEND and who have an EHCP, aged up to 19 years old.

The programme is five days a week, term time only.

The work placements at Palmers Gardens, Trowbridge include:-

Horticulture Skills

- Ground Maintenance
- Catering and Hospitality
- Retail

One day based in Frome with Working Futures as the learning provider offering functional mathematics, English and further developing their employability skills.

Over the coming months we will be looking forward to doing a cake sale alongside a uniform sale




