Year 10 Swanage Trips

They were looking at coastal processes and enjoyed throwing oranges into the sea to see which way longshore drift occurs. They also managed to squeeze in some fish and chips.



Year 8 Charmouth Trips



Our students had great fun going to the Jurassic Coast to see what the geology

of the coast was like and see some real life landslides that they had been studying in class. The students

were also lucky enough to have a session with the wardens from the Charmouth Heritage Centre where they went fossil hunting. The students were very fortunate to find a whole

range of fossils from ammonites to an Ichthyosaurus vertebrae which dates back 195 million years.

'After we arrived in Charmouth we split up into two groups for our activities. Each group spent time on the beach searching for fossils and sea glass along the shoreline. We managed to find some magnificent pieces including ammonites and belemnites. After fossil hunting we got to visit the Charmouth Heritage Fossil Museum so we could learn more about how fossils are formed. Unfortunately, on Monday the weather was windy and rainy but that did not spoil our fun. At lunch we all had fish and chips followed by ice cream. Me and my peers really enjoyed this trip and will remember it as one of the best.'

The success of this project has set a high standard for future endeavours, and the school encourages these young artists to continue being ambitious and imaginative in their artistic pursuits next year. With such


a strong foundation, there is no doubt that the Year 7 students at Buckler's Mead Academy have bright artistic futures ahead of them.
