Year 10 Tate St Ives Trip

We had a wonderful day at Tate St Ives where we saw many different pieces of art using various techniques. These also included some interactive moving pieces. We visited the art gallery on





the seafront and the Barbara Hepworth sculpture garden where we learnt more about the artist and saw her pieces in situ in the garden of the

house she lived and worked in. We were all encouraged to take photos that we have since used to inspire our art work both in content and techniques used.



Year 8 Lyme Regis Trips

Year 8 Geographers have been very lucky with both the trips happening during the heatwave this term. They had great fun looking at coastal processes and the local geology of the area, which included finding lots of fossils.

On Friday 11th July I went to

Lyme Regis with the M side of Year 8. Mr Hawkins showed us the sedimentary rocks and limestone. We got to explore the beach. As I walked on to the beach I saw large rocks by the cliff. There also wasn't much of an overhang on the cliffs; this tells





us that there was a recent fall or erosion. In order to keep safe we stayed at least five metres away from the cliffs at all times and we also didn't go in the sea. Despite this I still had a really good time!

We each sketched a drawing of the cliffs to our left with the sea. It was a nice view! Did you know that Lyme Regis is a crucial place for finding fossils? This is because of its unique geological makeup and the abundant and well preserved specimens that are found there.

We also found seaglass, which is glass that the sea has smoothed and shaped! The way we recycle now is different to what we used to do, our recycling has improved over time, but sea glass can still be found. Mr Hawkins explained that Lyme Regis had built some walls to protect itself, and its coastline.

Lyme Regis has a curved coastline. This is due to a combination of geological factors and coastal processes. We then had lunch and were able to go off in groups of three and were given a school number in order to stay safe. We were able to buy fish and chips and ice cream if we wished, although there were lots of seagulls around, so we had to be careful with our food. One even swooped down and grabbed my sandwich from my hand! The Lyme Regis trip was fascinating! I highly recommend going if you have the chance to in Year 8. - Ella Shortland

Year 10 Geography Fieldwork at Swanage

Year 10 Geography Fieldwork Trip to Swanage- both days we were very lucky to be down at the coast in the heatwave. Students worked well to collect their data for the Physical Fieldwork enquiry which is linked to their Paper 3 exam. They also



had a chance to grab an ice cream or some chips. It was also lovely to be complimented on how well behaved our students were by members of the public.

Learning Support Classroom - Mini Garden Project

Some of the students have turned a piece of scrapland behind the Learning Support Base into a small garden. They grew a small variety of vegetables from seed and planted them out, carefully weeding and watering daily. Alfie picked the first



courgette this morning and zoomed it to Food Technology where it is now being used in a spanish omelette!

Forest School Survival Days 2025

After a year of Forest School sessions the students celebrated by taking part in several survival days.

These all day sessions allowed the opportunity to practice the skills that have been learnt over the year and have the time to really enjoy themselves.

Performing Arts Opportunities through the Westlands and Octagon partnership

This year a number of students at Buckler's Mead Academy were fortunate enough to participate in the phenomenal Octagon/Westlands 2025/26 Creative Learning and Education Programme, 'Elevate'.

Students participated in two workshops with 'Motion House Theatre Company', whose sell-out productions integrate athletic physicality, powerful narrative, incredible digital imagery and emotive sound scores.

With a selection of other local primary and secondary schools, the programme culminated with the stunning and awe-inspiring 'This Is Me' performance at Westlands Entertainment Complex on 2nd July.

Made up of four Year 7s, three Year 8s, and three Year 9s, their piece called 'Embrace', mixed dance, physical theatre, poetry and an incredible soundtrack.
