

KS2 & KS3

Finches

This term we have been very busy! In theme we have been learning about Roald Dahl. We have explored the books through role play and attention autism.

Through Critchill code we have been learning about mental wellbeing. We have learnt to identify emotions, how to regulate and relax and how our bodies may feel when we are feeling certain emotions. We also had a special visit from PCSO Shelley Day who taught us all about stranger danger!

Starlings

This term Starlings Class have explored the author Roald Dahl. We have listened to the story of George's Marvellous Medicine, acted out the story and made our own mixtures. We explored how we could separate mixtures and what is meant by a solid, liquid and gas. We also learnt about Charlie and the Chocolate factory, exploring melting and cooling whilst designing our own chocolate bar. We have also had fun exploring being outdoors during Critchill Code.

Owls

This term we've been exploring Roald Dahl and looked at lots of his books and famous characters. Willy Wonka and the Umpa Loopas came to visit, we've made our own marvellous medicine and we made potions that turned one of the staff into a mouse! We've also tried snozzcumbers, whizzpopping juice and hot frogs!

Ravens

This term we have enjoyed sessions with Jackdaws this term. They have explored Verdi through dancing and exploring different musical instruments. They will finish the unit of work by performing to other classes in the school.

Kestrels

This term we have been learning about Farming and the countryside. Pupils have grown cucumber, sweetcorn, beetroot and carrot plants. Pupils have enjoyed watching their seeds germinate and grow into small plants that they have been measuring in their maths sessions. Pupils have enjoyed making foods such as carrot cake and apple crumble using locally grown produce. Kestrels class have also been exploring where foods are grown and farmed from across the world and how these are transported to other countries.

Duke of Edinburgh Expedition 2025

On the 9th and 10th of June, our Duke of Edinburgh participants undertook the final 'Expedition' part of the award. This involved 2 days walking along Colliers Way cycle track which links Frome to Radstock. On their journey, pupils learnt about local history and had a special task to investigate habitats.

They compiled an A-Z of animals and plants along the route. A wide wide range of plants and animals including deer, kites, oxeye daisies and giant leaves were discovered! Participants showed fantastic teamwork over the journey especially when making their own lunch, helping to motivate each other and share the task of carrying the equipment.

A fantastic time was had by all and we are delighted to announce that everyone who completed the Expedition has now achieved the highly regarded Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award.

Post 16

As part of their ongoing work in preparation for adulthood, pupils in Post 16 were visited by Barclays Bank staff. They learnt about a wide range of banking related matters such as debit, credit, mortgages, scams, fraud and savings interest. Pupils put their maths skills to good use by adding up the cost of frequently bought items and then budgeting by making decisions about what they didn't really need to buy. Post 16 pupils were also visited by a representative from Fair Frome. They learnt about how food at a food bank is collected, how it is distributed and the other services Fair Frome provides. Pupils were keen to find out which was the most donated item to the food bank (baked beans). They also learnt about the various employment opportunities organisations such as Fair Frome have to offer.

Uniform
