# Headteacher's Address

Dear Parents and Carers.

It is hard to believe that we have now completed the penultimate term of the year and only have one term left before the summer holidays!

I have been very proud to see how well Year 11 are conducting themselves during their exam season – it is a stressful time but they have been good natured, focused and punctual. It is pleasing to see so many have signed up to revision sessions over the holiday – a huge thank you to teachers for being willing to give up their holiday time to support their students. I remember Year 11 coming to us as Year 7 – it only seems the blink of an eye and here they are ready to end their time with us and move on to their next adventure. We are all looking forward to celebrating their time with us at our Leavers' Assembly during the morning of 29<sup>th</sup> June followed by the Prom that same evening. It is always a lovely event and a fitting way to end our time together.

Looking forwards, Year 10 are in the process of being interviewed for the roles of prefects and Head Students as I write – I look forward to announcing the successful candidates next term.

You will see later in the newsletter that Mr Jones has decided to step down as Head of Key Stage 4; I would like to thank him for all his hard work in this role and the support that he has given to students, parents and carers.

As we come towards the end of the school year, we would remind parents that a letter was sent home last term as a reminder that all students should be in the correct uniform every day – the vast majority of students do arrive looking smart and wearing the right uniform but we are noticing that a small minority are not getting it right.

# **Attendance Matters**

We are pleased to see that attendance is improving – we now need to keep working on this to ensure that everyone is here to receive their education. Attendance at school every day that it is open is a legal requirement; whilst everyone should be aiming for 100%, it is recognised by the government that there will be some days when people are too ill to attend school, therefore 96% is the target for schools. All students should aim to be in school every day.

Punctuality is as important as attendance; please note that students should be in their tutor rooms at 8.45 – not arriving on site at that time. All students are expected to be on site by 8.40 at the very latest. We have seen a real improvement in punctuality to school; please continue to support your child to be here promptly so that they have a positive start to the day.

# **Maths**


Year 7 and 8 top set Maths students took the UK Mathematics Trust Junior Maths Challenge in the last week of April. The two classes did a bit of preparation in class (with their teachers Mrs Kench and Mrs Loud) ahead of the challenge, to sharpen their Maths skills, and it certainly paid off: comfortably the best results we've had in recent years, possibly ever: 4 gold, 13 silver and 18 bronze certificates. Bearing in mind that the UKMT only award certificates to the top 40% that take the challenge (usually only top sets), these 35 certificates are quite a haul from our 58 top set students.

Well done to all those who took part in the challenge, but congratulations to all those who will receive certificates, particularly those who achieved the coveted gold ones: Henry Witcombe, Jaime Chapman, Myles Brice and Alfie Cook. In addition to these great results, two students: Henry and Jaime achieved marks that were high enough to get into the next (international) round, which they will sit in June. What an achievement - we wish them good luck!


# **Carnegie Book Shadowing Club**

## **Drama Club**




